She was born Abt. 1634, and died Bef. 1662. He married (2) SARAH LEE NEE UNKNOWN Abt. 1668 in Boston, Suffolk, MA.

JOHN BUCKMAN Sr. is first recorded at Boston, Massachusetts Bay Colony at the birth of his daughter 5 July 1653. He died at Boston between 20 April and 13 May 1681. (Suffolk Co. Probate #1183).

John married first HANNAH or ANN _____. As these names were used interchangeably this is probably one person. The only recording of Hannah's existence is at the birth of her children. John married secondly SARAH _____. Sarah's name appears as the mother of John's younger children. It also appears as a signator, relinquishing dower, to the deeds of their property.

John owned property on or near the waterfront in Boston. Walter Merry of Boston, Shipwright, sold on 11 Feb 1655 to George Palmer of Boston, Wine Cooper, land with house, warehouses, wharves, etc. that "more or lesse Bounded upon John Buckmans land on the North West" (Suffolk Co. Deeds 2:254, 255). A deed dated 7 Aug 1657 shows the same George Palmer selling land to Elias Parkman of Boston, Mariner, that was "bounded.. by lands of John Buckman in the west" (ibid. 3:388, 389).

It is likely that this is the same John Buckman whose boat of six or seven tons was attached by the constable of Lynn in connection with a suit brought by Joseph Armitage against John Buckman for six pounds. This stemmed from a five pound debt of William Butler to Joseph Armitage which John Buckman had promised to pay in 1652 although "he took his wife bare, without anything" (Joseph Armitage v. John Buckman, Salem Quarterly Court, Nov. 1659, Records and Files of the Quarterly Courts of Essex County Massachusetts [Essex Institute: Salem, Mass., 1912J, Vol.11, p. 185, 186, hereafter Essex Qrtly. Court). This statement leads one to wonder about the possibility that John Buckman's then wife, Hannah/Ann, might be the widow of William Butler.

On 13 January 1673 John and Sarah Buckman sold all but a small portion of their property In Boston to Samuel Townsend of Rumney Marsh reserving for himself and his heirs forever "free privillidge & enjoyment of egress & Regress Passage.. in to and from his sd Dwelling house into the street...." (Suffolk Deeds, 9:9,10). The property was identified as being in the North end of Boston with a portion fronting upon the street "Leading from the Mill Bridge toward winnesemmet fferrye." A little over a year later, on 27 May 1674, they sold the remaining land and the house to Samuel Townsend with John Buckman reserving the right to live in the house during the remainder of his natural life. The deed went on to say that should Townsend "cause to pull down a part or the whole thereof" he would be obligated to "provide a convenient Roome for him the sd Buckman to Reside In.,," "This deed, as the previous, was signed by both John and Sarah with their marks (ibid. 9:10-12).

John Buckman's will, dated 20 April 1681, was allowed 28 July 1681 (Suffolk Co. Probate #1183):

In the name of God Amen I John Buckman of Boston in New England Senior being in a Competant measure of health and of a Sound Memory and under understanding yet Considering the frailty of mans life... Doo make and ordaine this to bee my last will and testament revoking and Nulling all other willes by mee formerly made In manner following First I Bequeath my So ule unto the Everlasting arm es of Jesus Christ my Saviour hoping through his grace to obtain Eterlasting life when this miserable life is Ended And my body to the Earth from whence it came.. Itm I give and Bequeath my' Just debts and funeral expenses first being discharged unto my' two children Mary Buckman and Jeremiah Buckman all the Estate I shall leave behind mee at the time of my decease Equally to be divided between them. Only I give unto my Daughter Mary my best furniture besides the said halfe part & a Chest and Drawers belonging to it and I doo make and constitute my lovinge friends Mr. John Viall Junior and Samuell Townsend to be the Executors and overseers of this my last will desiring them to take care that this last will may be performed and that my two children above named may have what I leave behind mee at my decease when they come to age. And In testimony that this is my last will I have hereunto Set my hand & Seale this twentieth day of Aprill -Anno Dm one Thousand Sixe hundred & Eighty and one. 1681.

Samuel Townsend renounced his Executorship 28 July 1681 and Thomas Kemble deposed that he was present when John Buckman signed his will and that Nicholas Shaply, another witness, was also present. This done Mr. Viale, Executor, offered it to probate and it was allowed by James Addington, Clerk (ibid.). An Inventory of the Estate of John Buckman was taken 13 May 1681 by _____ Hudsons and William Ireland. It consisted of clothing, bedding, pots and pans. an old cupboard and a wooden spinning wheel.

On 24 September 1684 the Court gave all of his estate to the widow as John Buckman had left no provision for her in his will (Suffolk Co. Probate, 9:43). This Is the same year that the son, Jeremiah. chose Lee as his guardian.

Children, first two by Hannah/Ann (Boston Births, Baptisms, Marriages, and Deaths 1630-1699, 9th Report of the Record Commissioners, Boston City Document 130 [Boston:18831, 41,73,87,103,113 hereafter Boston VRs):

- i. HANNAH2 b. 6 Jul 1653; d. by 1681 (Not in Father's will). She may have married a Walter Thomas. That she married a Thomas who was dead by 25 Oct 1676 is proven by the fact that on that date she Is referred to as "Hannah Thomas, widow" when she posted bond for the administration of the "Estate of her late brother John Buckman junior deceased..." (Suffolk Co. Probate #835). It is probable that the Hannah, born at Boston 23 Sep 1673 to Walter & Hannah Thomas is her child (Boston VRs, 129).
- ii. JOHN, d. April 1676 in the Sudbury fight. In "Report on the Sudbury Fight, April, 1676" there is the statement that a John Buckman, junior "dyed in the country's service, 1676" (New England Historical And Genealogical Register 20:349, hereafter Register). Though there is no record for the birth of this John. the use by his father of the appellation "Senior" and of this John, both in the records of the Sudbury fight and by his sister, as "Junior" leaves room for little doubt.
- iii. DANIEL, b. 29 Mar 1660; d. by 1681 (Not in Father's will).

- iv. SAMUEL, b. 17 Feb 1663; d. by 1681 (Not in Father's will).

To date, no marriage records have been found for John and the names of his first two wives are learned from the birth records of his first three children. However the name Hannah and Ann were sometimes interchanged and he may have only been married twice, since no death records have been found for either Hannah or Ann Buckman. There has been speculation that John was the estranged son of William Bucknam of Charlestown, MA. This is disproved by the request to the courts which was filed on June 06, 1695 by William's daughter-in-law Judith requesting subsistence for the tending of her deceased husband's brother John, who had been living with them for 20 years. (Evidently, this John was abducted by his grandmother shortly after his mother's death, raised by her and in 1672, while living at Rehoboth, MA, was a partner in a silver mine at Providence, RI. Around 1678 he was "struck dumb" and didn't regain his speech until 1696.) Gravesend (Long Island, NY) was divided in 1645 into thirty-nine lots and among those receiving shares were: Richard Stout, John Buckman, Samuel Spicer, Nicholas Stillwell, John Bowne, William Goulding, William Compton, and others whose names are familiar in the

In 1652 John Buckman, "although he took his wife bare, without anything", promised to pay £5 to Joseph Armitage to settle a claim against the estate of William Butler. (This would imply that Hannah was William's widow, or child.) On February 11, 1655 Walter Merry of Boston, Shipwright, to George Palmer of Boston, Wine Cooper, land "that more or lesse bounded upon John Buckmans Land on the orthwest". On August 07, 1657 George Palmer sold to Elias Parkman of Boston, Mariner, land bounded "by lands of John Buckman in the west". In November 1659, Armitage bought suit against John which resulted in the constable of Lynn, MA attaching John's boat of "sixe or seven tonnes" until payment of £6 (the original £5 due plus a £1 penalty assessed by the court) was remitted. On January 01, 1673 John & Sarah Buckman (as indicated by their marks, vice signatures) sold to Samuel Townsend of Rumney arsh land in the Northend of Boston "leading from the Mill Bridge toward winnesemmet fferrye" with the provision of "free privillidge and enjoyment of egress and regress passage...into and from his sd dwelling house into the street". On May 27, 1674 John & Sarah Buckman sold to Samuel Townsend land & dwelling provided that John could reside in the house until his death and that if Townsend "cause to pull down a part or the whole thereof...(he must) provide a convenient room for him the sd Buckman to reside in.". In 1676: "Peter Cole of charlsTowne was Indicted by the name of Peter Cole for yt he not having the feare of God before his eyes & being Instigated by the Divil did on or about the first of July last Comitt Adultery on the body of Sarah Buckman wife to John Buckman of Boston contrary to the peace of our Sovereigne Lord the Kind his Croune and dignity the lawes of God & of this Jurisdiction to wch Indictment ye prisoner at the barr pleaded not Guilty & declared he would be tried by God & ye Country : After the Indictment & evidences in the case produced were read Comitted to the Jury & are on file wth the Reccords of this Court the Jury brought in their virdict they found him not Guilty according to Indictment but Guilty of unlawfull & uncivil Accompanying wth the said Sarah Bucknam wife of Jno Bucknam being in bed together The Court sentenct him to goe from henc to ye place whene he Came & thence on the next fifth day after lecture by the marshall Generall & his order to the Carried to the Gallows & there stand wth a halter throune over ye Gallowes to stand on hower & then tooke doune & tyed to the Cartr taile & be severely whipt wth thirty nine stripe & paying his prison ffees was dischargd." "Sarah Bucknam was alike Indicted as said Cole mutatis mutandis & being found by the Jury as above not Guilty according to Indicatment but Guilty of like uncivill Accompanying wth Peeter Cole being in bed together had the like sentenc pronouncnt agt hir." And in testimony that this is my last will I have hereunto set my hand and seale this twentieth day of Aprill anno dm one Thousand Sixe hundred and Eighty one. July 28, 1681: Samuel Townsend renounced his Executorship and Thomas Kemble deposed that he and Nicholas Shepley were present at the signing of the will (Case #1183, Recorded.July 20, 1681). An inventory of John's estate was performed on May 13, 1681 and consisted of: no real estate; 2 ruggs (00 16 00); 3 shirtes, 3 shoohes, 3 shawls (01 05 00); a parcell of his wearing clothes (01 00 00); one old chest of drawers (00 10 00); a meale trough, 2 iron potts & potthookes tongs & gridiron (00 10 00); ane bed, bedstand, 2 pillows, 1 old rugge & some other ould bedding (02 00 00); one ould cubberd (00 05 00); two pewter dishes, 3 earthen dishes & 1 pan (00 04 00); one wooden spinning wheele and cards (00 04 00); Total: £06 14s 00d. On September 24, 1684 the widow of John Buckman was granted his entire estate since he made no provision for her in his will.

SOLDIERS IN KING PHILIP'S WAR
Chapter 2, Part 4

On the 19th, the Indians in great force fell upon the town, but were soon "beaten off without doing much harm." Just before the fight seven of Mosely's men and three others were sent out to scout, and seven of the number were cut off and killed. The Indians made no further general attack after this repulse, and withdrew to winter quarters. Capt. Mosely's forces, however, still remained in the western towns with other troops, under Major Appleton, until as late as November 20th; for, on the 16th, the Court authorized a letter to Appleton directing the withdrawal of the main force, and urging especially the dismissal of the troops of Capt. Mosely. The United Colonies were now in full preparation for the grand movement against the Narragansets; and the "Privateers" with their dashing leaders were needed. The western and outlying towns were garrisoned as securely as might be, and all available "veterans" hurried in to swell the army of the three colonies to 1000 men, for this special service to Narraganset. Much of great interest in the organization of this army must be passed over here.

The quota of Massachusetts was to be 527 men, Plymouth 158, and Connecticut 325. Rhode Island was not "counted in," for reasons best known to our dear old Puritan fathers. Josiah Winslow, Esq., Governor of Plymouth Colony, was made Commander-in-chief of the army, and under him Major Samuel Appleton commanded the Massachusetts forces, consisting of six companies, viz.: Maj. Appleton's own, Capt. Mosely's, Capt. Joseph Gardner's, Capt. Nathaniel Davenport's, Capt. James Oliver's, and a troop under Capt. Thomas Prentice. Major Robert Treat commanded the Connecticut forces, five companies under Capts. Siely, Gallop, Mason, Wats; and Major William Bradford two Plymouth companies, his own and Capt. John Gorham's. The Massachusetts forces mustered on Dedham Plain, where, on Dec. 9, Gen. Winslow assumed command. There were then "465 fighting men," besides Capt. Prentice's troop.

It seems, from the Journal, that no settlement had been made with Mosely's and Appleton's troops for the campaign in the west, and on December 10th, twenty-seven pages of the book are entirely devoted to their accounts, and few, if any, other items are given under that date save such as relate to them. The captains had paid out small sums at different times, and the towns of "Hadly," "Malbrow," "Mendam," "Lining" (Lynn), and many constables, merchants and others, are credited by cash, clothing, etc., to these troops; and on that date Treasurer Hull pays them the balance of their accounts. Among the few precious lists of names preserved in the Massachusetts Archives is the "Muster Roll of Capt. Mosely's company, taken at Dedham the 9 of Xber, 1675." I have arranged this list and the credits of December 10-20 and January, alphabetically, and tested them carefully otherwise, and find that the greater part of his company were his "veterans." The following account may be of interest.

The town of Dunstable, per Constable Jona. Tyng, brings in a bill of about œ100 for billeting Mosely's men, ammunition, etc.

SOLDIERS IN KING PHILIP'S WAR

Chapter 17, Part VI

The whole command now devolved upon Capt. Holyoke, who led his shattered force, fighting every rod of the way, to the south side of Deerfield meadow to the place known as the "Bars." That the retreat did not end in a general massacre is doubtless due to the skill and bravery of Capt. Holyoke in keeping the main body together, and in protecting flank and rear while pushing forward to avoid the chance of ambushes. As it was, they found, on arriving at

Hatfield, that some fortyUnknownfive or more of their men were missing. Rev. Mr. Russell's letter of May 22d gives some account of the losses, and says that six of the missing have come in, reducing the number of the lost to thirtyUnknowneight or thirtyUnknownnine. Of the Indian losses he gives the report of Sergt. Bardwell that he counted upwards of one hundred in and about the wigwams and along the river banks, and the testimony of William Drew and others that they counted some "sixUnknownscore and ten." "Hence we cannot but judge that there were above 200 of them slain."

Of the slain of our soldiers the following list is taken from the best available authorities. The battle and the leader are perpetuated in the name "Turner's Falls," applied to the scene of the fight.

The two servants mentioned in the following petition were doubtless apprentices whose service was needed by widow Turner about the Captain's business, now left to her management. Buckman (or Bucknam) may have been of Charlestown, son of William. His name appears in a later ledger of John Hull, and John Sawdy was probably son of John of Boston.

Soldiers credited under Capt. William Turner:

The credits above mostly represent those soldiers who served under Capt. Turner from February 20th until April 7th, and the sum œ02 04s. 06d. covers the time until their arrival home, about seven weeks and five days from their marching away. After April 7th, those of his soldiers who remained in the West received credit at the several garrisons at which they were located, and their names will appear in that connection; and this is the reason that so few who were in the "Falls Fight" are credited as serving under Capt. Turner. After his death the officers of the garrison signed their vouchers.

The following list is the most important of all these that are preserved pertaining to the soldiers of Capt. Turner, as it contains the names of all the soldiers of whom the committee could find any trace. The grant was made of a township of land, as near as might be to the scene of the "Falls Fight," to all officers and soldiers who were engaged therein. This alphabetical list was evidently kept in the hands of the committee, and new names are added in different hands through several years. A few fragmentary papers are preserved in the archives in connection with this list, that show the methods of proving and identifying claims.

A certificate from John Bradshaw, still alive in February, 1735, declares that himself, Mr. Isaiah Tay, late of Boston, deceased, who was a lieutenant under Capt. Turner, and Nathaniel Pierce, of Woburn, were in the fight. John Dunkin, of Worcester, certifies, April 1st, 1735, that his uncle Jabez Dunkin was killed in the fight, and applies as his proper heir. John Chase, of Newbury, certifies that he was in the expedition with Capt. Turner, and helped to bury him, and that Samuel Coleby, late of Almsbury, deceased, was with him. Some other papers of like tenor are preserved, and several fragments of evidence from town and church records, showing that the committee demanded proofs before granting the claims. The residences of the soldiers were given according to the best knowledge of the committee, very often at loss for any information after the lapse of sixty years.

Many of the soldiers, after the war, had removed to interior towns, and their descendants to different States, and sometimes the present residence of the claimant would be given as the supposed home of the soldier ancestor. Very many of the soldiers from the East were single men, boys and apprentices, and when these were killed their names were soon lost, unless some record was made. At Northampton a record of the death of thirteen of the soldiers, who had been in garrison there, together with that of Capt. Turner, is found upon the town books under date of May 19, 1676, with the comment, "all slain by Indians."

The committee finding this record, and not knowing otherwise, assigned Northampton, or "North," as their residence. It will be seen that one hundred and thirtyUnknownfive names appear, while up to 1741 only ninetyUnknownnine claimants had been admitted. This may be explained by the fact that so many of those engaged in the affair were strangers in the colony, or mere boys, who left no legal claimants in this country. In other cases it would be difficult to prove relationship such as would entitle to a claim, especially when the soldier ancestor had removed to a distant part of the country.

In March of 1684 "Jeremiah Buckman, who had lived a long time at Ipswich with Joseph Lee, chose said Lee to be his guardian". On March 09, 1714 Jacob Brown sold property to Jeremy Buckman of Ipswich, laborer. From 1729 thorough 1731 Jeremiah was taxed in the Beverly district of Ipswich. In 1730 Jeremiah Buckman, yeoman, purchased land in Ipswich. (viz.) To set us of three miles and an half wide by a parellel line with the northerly line of said Town. Begining at oxford and Runing to grafton In order to make a precinct, that so we may have the worship of God set up amongst us, which we think Cant but be a Reasonable Request and what we hope you will not Deny unto us, which as in Duty Bound we hartily pray for. Timothy Carter, Isaac Manning, Thomas Whittemore, Josiah Bond, Daniell Greenwood, Joseph Sparrowhack, Isaac Gale, Nathan Hiscock, Jabesh Pratt, John Allen, Samuel Buck, Junr., Jabesh Pratt, Junr., Jeremiah Bukman, Johnathan Dwinell, Amos Singletary, Ebenezar Peirce, Thomas Hall, Ebenezar Sibly, Garsham Bigelow, Samuel Boutell, John Allen, Junr., Johnathan Park, Robert Goddard, Francis Kidder, Edmond Barten, Abel Chase, Richard Singletary, William Fiske, Elisha Goddard, Garsham Waite, George March, Johnathan Fuller, Johnathan Waters, Theophilous Kinne, Daniel Buckman, Samuel Buck, Thomas Gould, Edward Lyon, Elisha Barton, Thomas Holman, Jeremiah Buckman, Junr., Solomon Holman, Robert Jeneson. Failing to secure

from the town favorable action, the petitioners now applied to the General Court, setting forth their desire and grievances, and praying that by special enactment they might be set off as a Precinct.

In view of this action on their part, at a special meeting of the town held Dec. 8th:

It was put to vote, to see wheather the Town would Chuse a Committy to shew to ye grate and General Court, the Resons why the prayers of Solomon Holman and Jeremiah Buckman and others, set forth in their petitions to said Court should not be granted and ye vote past in ye affirmative." Voted that Elisha Putnam, Benjamin Woodbery and Samuel Chase be a Committy for the above said service to shew to the grate and General Court. In answer to the petition above referred to, a committee was appointed by the General Court to visit the town and examine into the circumstances of the parties at variance, and report conclusions.

On August 29, 1743:

Put to vote to see if the Town would Chuse a Committy to go to the great and Generall Court to make Replie against the petition of Daniel Boyden put into the great and generall Court the last may sessions to see if the said Court would set off the north-west part of Sutton, and the south west part of Worcester, and the south-east part of Lester, and the north east part of Oxford and to make a Distinct precinct and the vote past in the negative. In the autumn of this year, notwithstanding the remonstrance of the town through its committees, the General Court responded favorably to the petition of the northerly inhabitants, and set them and their estates off as a separate and distinct precinct. The proceedings in the matter were as follows; commencing with the report of the committee appointed to visit the town: "The Committee appointed by this Court to repair to ye Town of Sutton, on ye Petition of Solomon Holman and Jeremiah Buckman, did attend said service in February 1742, having first given seasonable notice to said Town and having viewed ye several parts thereof and heard the Parties, and Considered their Circumstances, are of oppinion that ye Petition be granted, and that a Line be drawn from ye Westerly Bounds of Grafton Parallell with ye North line of ye Town of Sutton and three miles South from it till it meet with ye easterly Bounds of ye Town of Oxford, and ye Inhabitants of Sutton living to ye northward of said line with their families and estates be set off a separate and Distinct Precint with ye same powers and Privileges as other Parishes and Precincts within this Province by Law hold and Injoy which is Humbly submitted. By order of the Committee Jos. WILDER." "In ye House of Representatives Oct. ye 28, 1743: Read again and ordered that ye Inhabitants and their Estates within ye Limits mentioned in ye foregoing Report (excepting only such qualified Voters with their estates as shall, within one year from this time, signifie to this Court, their Desire to continue to ye first Parish in Sutton) be set off a separate and Distinct Precinct, and that they Injoy ye Powers and Privileges which Precincts ought, by Law, to Injoy, Sent up for Concurrence T. CUSHING, Speaker. In Council, Oct. 28, 1743. Read & Concurred, J. WILLARD, Secry Consented to W. SHIRLEY" "In ye House of Representatives, Nov. 11th, 1743. Whereas the Northerly part of Sutton was erected into a separate and distinct Precinct by a vote of this Court on the 28 day of Oct. anno Domini 1743 and there being no provision therein obliging ye Inhabitants of said Precinct to pay all past Ministerial Charges and assessments that have arisen in ye Town of Sutton. Therefore ordered that ye Inhabitants of said New Precinct be, and hereby are obliged, to pay their Proportionable parts and Dues to all past ministerial Charges and assessments in ye Town of Sutton, as also their Proportionable of the sum that ye Inhabitants of said Town of Sutton have agreed to raise for ye paying of their Ministers Salary this present year ending in March next, any thing in ye Vote constituting them a Precinct to ye Contrary notwithstanding. Sent up for Concurrence, T. CUSHING, Speaker. In Council Nov. 11, 1743. Read and Concurred J. WILLARD, Sec'y. Consented to W. SHIRLEY." Worcester, ss. To Richard Moore Esq. one of his Maj's Justices &c. We the Subscribers, Inhabitants of ye Second Precinct in Sutton in said County hereby signify to you our Desire that a warrant may issue agreeable to Law for calling a Meeting in said Precinct as soon as may be &c. (which was to choose Parish officers.) Jeremiah Buckman Ebenezer Pierce Daniel Buckman Solomon Holman Thomas Gould Francis Kidder Abel Chase. The warrant appointed the first meeting to be held at the house of Richard Singletary on ye 26 of Dec. 1743 -- and the warrant which was directed to Jeremiah Buckman, has this return upon it. "Sutton, Decem'r 26, 1743. "By vertue of this Warrant, to me Directed, I have notified ye Freeholders and other Inhabitants of this ye same at Mr. John Singletary's Mill Doore." "By Mr. Jeremiah Buckman one of the Petitioners of S'd Warrant." Jan. 23, 1743-4. "A blazing star or comet in the West has appeared for near two months; at first small, but now of great length beyond what I ever saw. This is the third that has of late years appeared. I would not be dismayed at ye signe of Heaven, but O ye sinners fear who live in ye neglect of God and O y't I might so far regard it as to trim my lamp and get ready."(*) Feb. 16th. A more particular description is given of this comet. "The blazing star from the south-west has appeared near three months. It was small -- it passed by north of the sun; when it first appeared its Tail was about a yard long to appearances, was bent towards the Equator. When it came down about north of the sun its Tail was pointed towards the North Pole -- Its Tail appeared about 12 Degrees in Length at a farther distance from the sun. Its Body or Nucleous appeared about 3 Inches in Diameter to the naked eye. Feb. 4th. It appeared half an hour after sunset about half an hour high and about an hour and a half to the North of the sun, it being so near in the sun gloss its Tail did not appear above two yards long -- next morning it rose before the sun and appeared much in the same shape. Its tail must be several millions of miles long. The Lord sanctify so awful a token of an approaching God, who thus hangs out his ensign in ye skies y't ye nations may tremble before Him." On October 20, 1743 Jeremiah Buckman of Sutton, house-carpenter, sold to Joseph Bucknum of Sutton, weaver, "housing and land where I now dwell and contains by estimation 60 A. in consideration of the sum of £20 paid by my son and also in consideration of his mortgage of the premises to myself and present wife for performing certain considerations and paying certain sums to my daughters as therein expressed...That whereas said Jeremiah Bucknum doth account that the above said land and buildings were worth £100 lawful money, out of that (he) reserved to (himself) and present wife Hannah, £37 10s. for support during life and that the remainder being £62 10s. should be divided to and amongst the said Joseph and his four sisters or their lawful representatives, namely: Martha Rogers, Hannah Masters, Sarah Dike, and Deborah Hull, said division to be equal and said daughters part to be paid within 4 years after the decease of the said Jeremiah Bucknum and said wife". In January 1747 Jeremiah was brought before the pastor of the First Church of Sutton to address charges of absenting . On May 25, 1747 Hannah, Daniel & Jeremiah Jr, petitioned "that our said Husband and Father is incapable of taking care of his worldly affairs" Three neighbors also deposed to this and that "it is needfull he should have a guardian" (Case #8735). On

August 19, 1747 Jeremiah, Jr presented an inventory for the estate of his father "said P Non: Compos".

Notes for JOHN BUCKMAN:

"The Story of Buckman Tavern" -- The Buckman Tavern was built in 1710 as a dwelling place for John Muzzey. John Buckman, the son of the aforementioned John married Ruth Stone and became the owner of the tavern in 1768. John was no stranger to the Tavern business having helped his father who had operated the Munroe Tavern, also located in Lexington. John had also been a cabinetmaker, a haberdasher, and a maker of potash.

On the night of April 18th, 1775, life was about to change forever. John was member of Captain John Parker's Company although not called to duty that night. It was a cold evening and the tavern soon was filled with Minute Men and townspeople. There was no peace, but much talking about the events of the evening. Tension filled the air. Solomon Brown

had passed ten British officers headed for Lexington. It was rumored that there was to be an attempt to capture Hancock and Adams who were in the Parsonage of the Reverend Jonas Clark. Sergeant Monroe immediately stationed eight men to guard the Parsonage. At about midnight the sound of galloping hoofs came down the Boston Road. The rider was Paul Revere! "The Regulars are out" he said – adding -- "Pass the word and be warned!" Captain Parker sent some of his men home but they were told to immediately return when the tattoo was drummed out.

In the long and anxious night John Buckman was here, there and everywhere. The hours sped by. The Bell in the Belfry still continued to send out its summons. At intervals musket shots were heard in the distance as the farmers still broadcast the alarm. Another horseman galloped along the road. "They are but a mile away". On orders from Captain Parker, William Diamond beat his drum. From all directions came men on the run. The Tavern was empty.

Captain Parker lined up his men on the common. Major Pitcairn [a British Officer] said to his men, [two to three hundred]--- "Stand your ground, do not fire unless fired upon." Captain Parker said to his men "We do not want a war but if there be one let it be a good one, and let it start here and now!" Major Pitcairn, who is riding back and forth said "Put down your muskets and disperse, ye rebels."

A shot rang out.

Eight men of Captain Parker's company soon lay dead; eleven were wounded. Jonathan Harrington, mortally wounded, crawled across the common then died in the arms of his wife on the doorstep of their home. Parson Clark moved about the common comforting the bereaved.

The American Revolution had begun and was not to end until April 19, 1783, eight years to the day. Throughout all of this Mrs. Buckman carried on feeding and caring for those who needed it. The women, dry eyed and courageous carried on their household chores and prepared to bury their dead.

Finally, near dawn, Mr. Buckman staggered up to bed. In the year following he ceased to be the innkeeper and sold the property to his brother-in-law Joseph Simonds. Six months later Ruth died. In 1778 Jonathan married Sarah Weld. They had four children. Eight years later on December 21, 1792, Jonathan passed away.
