Notes for Jesse Floyd Goins:

UPDATE 08 FEB 2004: My father, Donald O. Goins, wrote what he knew about the 'life history' of his father, Jesse F. Goins. This is the first 'draft/posting' of the history of my grandfather which will be updated periodically. The history at this time is as follows:

Jesse F. Goins -- From 1921 to 1973: Shortly after my brother, Jesse Edward "Jake" Goins, was born in Meadowbrook, WV, in 1920, "Pop" (as we called him) moved to Harrison County, Michigan. He, Curby Norris, Aunt Bertha and children, had a train of horses. He worked as a teamster hauling sand and gravel building Tamarack Road around Houghton Lake and Prudenville, Michigan.

In 1921, Pop moved to Kalkaska, Michigan, where I was born. Still having 1 modest dump truck and team, worked building railroad beds in that area.

In 1922 he moved to Boxtown, Ohio, where I believe my sister, Arcelia "Toots" was born. He lived in and hauled coal around the Zanesville, Ohio area for about a year, then moved back to Michigan in the fall of 1922. We lived in various areas where Pop found employment--Gratiot County, St. Louis, Breckenridge, and the Mt. Pleasant area where my brother, Wesley, was born in 1924. We lived on a farm on E. Broadway in Mt. Pleasant, Michigan. Pop worked at various jobs hauling beets, logs, oil well supplies for Atha Oil Company.

In the winter of 1924 the family moved back to Zanesville, Ohio. where Pop worked in the coal hauling business.

By 1930 he was working for himself and finally got into the general hauling business haling for Montgomery Ward, Cussin Fern and Martin Roseberg Wallpaper in 1937. He also took coal samples to Columbus, Ohio, to have coal tested for quality and type of coal. These were screenings not sold to the public, but Pop said there had to be a market for, then he got the tests back and took sample loads to Wyant Greenhouse and Consumer Brewery in Newark, Ohio.

In 1933 Pop got a contract at both companies. He eventually bought eight trucks, hand-loading coal and hauling 42 miles from the mine site to Newark. He had 7 drivers, plus himself, and hauled coal 7 Days a week. Back then I recall him saying he paved each driver \$15.00 per week. He hauled 20,000 tons to Wyants and 32,000 tons to Consumers from 1932 to 1934. In addition to coal, he did movings, and hauled pottery from Weller, Roseville, Burley Clay Products and pottery companies in the Zanesville area during the period from 1932 to 1935. During that time period he also hauled coal to Cooper Tire Company in Findlay, Ohio and Falters Packing in Columbus, Ohio.

In 1935 the U.S. government passed laws regulating licenses for hauling. Pop did not have the money to get the required license and Miller Trucking of Zanesville, Ohio, as well as some other businesses, obtained the license so he could continue his hauling business.

1937 was a bad year. We went into the business of hauling produce. Pop bought a fruit market on W. Main Street in Zanesville, Ohio, where he stayed until 1947 at which time he moved back to Michigan and relocated in Lansing. He and Mom (Reatha A. [McCuen] Goins) lived in the Lansing area where Mom passed away in August, 1960. A few years later Pop sold that house and returned to Zanesville where he remained until his death December 12, 1973.

Goins, a colored man from Stewart, Athens County, who had just been arrested, was arraigned in United States Court, TuesDay, on the charge of selling whiskey, five positive sales being alleged, without license. He was placed under \$300 bond, his case to be tried during the latter part of the week. He entered a plea of not guilty. -- Columbus Press.

Rebecca resided with her son (my grandfather), Jesse Floyd Goins, at 706 Front Street, Toledo, Lucas, OH at the time of her death. She is buried in Forest Cemetery, Toledo, OH. This information was obtained from her death certificate. Rebecca is my father's paternal grandmother.

UPDATE - August 2003: My daughter and I traveled from Michigan to Ohio late evening August 7, 2003 stopping in Toledo for the night. Our ultimate destination was Beverly, OH for the Stevens' Reunion on August 9, 2003. We had decided before starting out on our trip to stop at Forest Cemetery in Toledo to see if we could locate Great-Grandma Rebecca's grave and surprise my parents with the news once we arrived in Beverly. The staff provided us with the location and cornerstone number, then contacted the groundskeeper to assist us with locating the section where she was buried. We spent several hours with the groundskeeper 'poking and prodding' to find her cornerstone, but were unsuccessful. Since we still had several miles to travel to get to our destination, we ended our search shortly after noon and continued on our journey to Beverly.

UPDATE - October 5, 2003: Mom, Dad and my oldest brother traveled to Toledo yesterday (Oct. 4) to continue the search for Great-Grandma Rebecca's grave. Once again the groundskeeper assisted them. Within a couple of hours...EUREKA!...they found it! Our plans now are to place a headstone on her grave in the Spring of 2004. Ironically, the date that Great-Grandma Rebecca's grave was found was the same date she died--84 years ago.

Our search still continues to locate her husband, my Great-Grandfather, Hiram Goins.

Following a picnic dinner [served] on the lawn, the afternoon was spent ... literary exercises and games. The principal address was delivered by A. J. Barnett of Vincent OH. C, 5th U.S.C.T...just the talk that the company was being organized for the 27th Massachusetts Regiment. After I enlisted we stayed at Athens, Ohio a short time and then went to Delaware, Ohio, left there about September 1863. At Camp Delaware, when I left the hospital, I was put in Company E."

5. Thomas Lawson, illiterate, age 65 in 1896, farmer, resided in Cutler, Ohio, member of Co. G, 5th U.S.C.T. "I came here in 1852, lived only about a mile apart."

6. William Henry Dickinson, age 50 in 1896, farmer, resided in Cutler. "...I was not in the army. I knew [Ramsey] for a few years before he enlisted. I became acquainted with him soon after he came to Ohio from Virginia. About every time that the young people had a gathering I generally met this [Ramsey]. His son, John W. Ramsey, age 29 in 1896, farmer, and a resident of Cutler, Ohio, married my daughter. He used to take his bitters when we were young together, but he has been strictly temperate for a good many years."

7. James M. Goins, illiterate, age 50 in 1896, farmer, resident in the vicinity of Cutler. "...I served in the same regiment, but I was not acquainted with him, first knew him about 1866, he as living in below Cutler, and I was living in Amesville about then or twelve miles distant from his home."

8. William Male, illiterate, age about 59 in 1896, farmer, lived in the vicinity of Cutler. "...I was not in the army. Acquainted soon after his return, around here on this Big Run and he got to courting one of my sisters and finally married her...his only wife."

9. Thornton Harris, age 57 in 1896, farmer, resided in the vicinity of Cutler, Ohio. "...I enlisted in August 1864 as a Private in Co. C, 27th U.S.C.T....I was not with Alexander Ramsey in the army...I have known him for 40 years. I knew him for several years in Preston County, West Virginia. The nearest post office was Evansville, about eight miles apart, we lived, near Big Run, lived on same 160 acres, are second cousins...."
