Notes for MARY "MINNIE" JUDGE:

A Mary Judge, age 30, resident of Fermanagh, Ireland, arrived at Ellis Island on 8 March 1909, aboard the California. She was single and had sailed from Londonderry, Ulster, Ireland, UK. She is listed on Pg 181 Ln 4 of the ship's manifest. Said she was going to live with sister Mrs. Rose Digby, 24 Carlson St, Everett. Nearest relative was brother Frank? Judge of Fermanagh and she was going to Everett MA.

She had no occupation but could read and write.

Minnie Judge of Ederney arrived at Boston Harbor aboard the SS Peruvian which sailed from Londonderry on 19 Apr 1895, arriving in Boston on 2 May 1895. She was an 18 year old servant, could read and write, and her last residence before leaving Ireland was Ederney. Her cousin Mary Gallagher of 28 Union Park in Boston had paid her passage and she was enroute to see her. She had \$2.50 on her and one piece of baggage when she arrived.

She is also listed on the manifest of the SS Yarmouth which arrived in Boston on 2 May 1895. This might be some kind of transfer ship, as it sailed from Yarmouth to Boston on 2 May 1895.

- v. JOHN JUDGE, b. Abt. 1883, Ederny, Magherculmoney Parish, Co Fermanagh, Ireland.

Notes for JOHN JUDGE:

John had come to America and was living in Malden. He gave Frederick and Sarah a parrot. However, they had to give it away, because it whistled at girls passing by and had a habit of using colorful language. (Mom story)

John arrived in the US aboard the Parisian which sailed from Londonderry on 18 Sep 1909 to Boston, arriving on 27 Sep 1909. He had no money upon his arrival. Sister Sarah had paid his passage and he was enroute to see her at 117 Walnut Ave., Roxbury MA. He appears to have had reddish brown hair and brown eyes. His occupation is listed on the manifest as merchant/tailor and could read and write. His last residence

before leaving Ireland was Beragh.

Notes for SARAH ANN JUDGE:

There is a Sarah Judge, age 20, residence Fermanagh, who arrived at Ellis Island on 1 Aug 1906 aboard the Astoria. She was single and had sailed from Londonderry, Ulster, Ireland, UK. She is listed on Pg 57 Ln 11 of the ship manifest. Didn't see anyone who appeared to be traveling with her.

The Astoria was built by William Denny & Bros, LTD, Dumbarton, Scotland in 1884. 5086 gross tons; 439 (bp) ft long, 46 ft wide. Steam triple expansion engine, single screw. Service speed 14kts. Capacity 1000 passengers (120 1st class, 180 2nd class, 700 3rd class.)

Built for Shaw Savill Line, British flag, in 1884 and named Tainui. England-New Zealand service. Sold to Allan State Line, British flag, in 1884. Sold to Compania Transatlantica Line, Spanish flag, in 1897 and renamed Covadonga, Spain-West Indies service. Transferred to Shaw Savill Line, British flag, in 1899 and renamed Tainui. Transferred to Anchor Line, British flag, in 1899 and renamed Astoria. Glasgow-New York service. Laid up 1908-10, scrapped in 1910.

Notes for FREDERICK WILLIAM KELLEHER:

The house at 26 Clement St, Malden MA, was a 3-story building. The Kellehers lived on the 1st floor in 1914

Per my mom, Family lived at 123 Park St in Dorchester MA, from there moved to Meeting House Hill in Speedwell (sp?), then to Salem St in Reading MA, finally to 330 Lowell St in Reading, where Sarah died at home.

Per 1930 census, the house at 123 Park St in Boston was rented for \$38/mo. The family owned a radio.
