Notes for ARTHUR HEDERSON:

Arthur is mentioned in "The History of the Parish of St Rose" (by Rev. Michael J. Scanlon) as being one of the early Catholics in Chelsea and instrumental in the establishment of the parish.

Per 1850 census, the value of Arthur's real estate was \$200. The family surname was rendered Addison.

Per 1860 census, Arthur owned real estate worth \$350 and \$250 in personal property. He could read and write. The Hedersons lived in a house with 2 other families. The last name is misspelt Henderson.

Per 1870 census, Arthur owned real estate worth \$1800 and \$800 in personal property. The house was a single family dwelling. He could read and write, and was a US citizen. Arthur's name is rendered Alfred Henderson on the census.

Notes for CATHERINE HEDERSON:

Not sure if Catherine is indeed Patrick and Ann's daughter; she was listed last (and out of order) for the Arthur Hederson household in the 1870 census, occupation servant. It's possible she and Mary Hederson Kelleher may have been sisters and emigrated to the US, taking up residence with the Arthur Hederson family.

Catherine was still there at the time of the 1870 census. I'm not sure if her occupation (servant) means that was how she earned her bed and board with her relatives, or she was a "live-out" servant. She may also be the Catherine Conroy listed as witness to the marriage Dennis Kelleher and Mary Hederson.

For the time being she's here to keep from getting lost in the database.

Per 1910 census, Thomas was 30 and single. Says both parents were born in MA rather than IRE. He could read and write and had been employed the entire year. He was lodging with the Edwin R. Brink family. Edwin (75) was born in NY, while wife Eliza J. (72) was born in PA. Widowed daughter Jennie H. Riddick (42) was born in OH and had 2 children, both living, but neither were listed in the household.

Appears Thomas registered for the draft twice with two different years given for his birthday, although both day and month are the same. According to both registrations, he had blue eyes and black hair, was of medium height and build, and had no physical disqualifications. He was single. On the 1918 registration he listed his mother Jane as his nearest relative and stated that she was living in Chelsea MA.

Per 1930 census, Thomas was married at age 36. Said both parents were born in MA rather than IRE. He was not a veteran.

Fr. Charles Smith then became the Chelsea pastor [from May, 1848] until January 4, 1851, when he died. He purchased a school building from the Lynn authorities on January 9, 1849, and converted it into a chapel. At the same time he secured a large double house and a lot in Chelsea from the Winnisimmet Ferry Company; one half of this was converted into a chapel and the other was used as a priest's residence."

SAINT ROSE OF LIMA PARISH

"At Bishop Williams' accession the Catholics of both Chelsea and Lynn were under the care of Rev. (later Monsignor) Patrick Strain, the very efficient and successful brother of that very unsuccessful priest, the Rev. James Strain of Bishop Fenwick's time. At Chelsea the Gothic, brick church of St. Rose of Lima, on Broadway, which had long been building, was dedicated on August 30, 1866. On January 14th following, Chelsea and Lynn made separate parishes, at Father Strain's suggestion. Being offered his choice of the two places, somewhat to the general surprise he chose Lynn, perhaps because of certain recent disagreement with Chelsea parishioners over the question of Fenianism.

His successor at St. Rose's was Rev. James McGlew [1867-1902], who was to be the great figure in the growth of the parish. Ordained in Dublin in 1848, this able and zealous priest had seen years of missionary labor in India and in the diocese of Buffalo before coming to Boston. At the time of his advent to Chelsea he is described as a man of imposing appearance, straight as an arrow, with piercing eyes and a face that betokened firmness and determination. Strong in his convictions, outspoken in language, and something of an authoritarian, he was an excellent example of what is sometimes called "the old School" of pastors. At all events, the progress made under him was remarkable. He embellished and enlarged the church, paid off the debt, bought a rectory, erected a convent and schools for girls and boys, inaugurated numerous societies and devotional practices, built up a flourishing parish of over eight thousand people, and perhaps, stamped something of his own strong, ardent, Catholic spirit upon it.

Everett and Revere were attached to St. Rose's until 1885, when the parish of the Immaculate Conception, Everett was formed. Its story may be reserved to a later chapter, but that of its offshoot in Revere should be outlined here."

Volume 3, pages 265-66 HISTORY OF THE ARCHDIOCESE OF BOSTON

"The terrible conflagration of April 12, 1908, which laid waste more than half the city of Chelsea, left St. Rose's Church, school and convent in ruins. Fr. Thomas F. Cussack, the pastor, heart-broken of the disaster to his parish and his people, died ten months later, before much had been done towards reconstruction. His successor, Fr. William F. Powers (1909-1922), attacked the problem with skill and energy, and with a courage that proved infectious among his parishioners. By the end of his short but strenuous pastorate, the church had been rebuilt, a fine parish school erected, the Sisters provided with a spacious convent, and St. Rose's parish was itself again.

For the northern (Prattville) section of Chelsea and the eastern part of Everett, His Eminence* in September, 1913, established the parish of Our Lady of Grace. Two successive pastors, Fathers Peter C. Quinn and Thomas A. Walsh (1916-1942), labored upon the construction of the church, which was dedicated by the Cardinal on May 20, 1917. It is an attractive stone-and-brick edifice, of somewhat unconventional Gothic style; and it already has a large parish school adjoining it."

A Joseph P. Kelleher, shows up in the New Haven city directory, listed as boarding with the Kellehers and employed by the Hoggson & Pettis Mfg Co, beginning in 1892. He remains with the family until 1897, when

he moves to 293 Cedar. This is where Mary died on 21 October 1897. He's not listed in the 1898 New Haven directory; on 23 June 1898, he joined Company I of the 3rd Regiment, Connecticut Volunteer Infantry, in Niantic CT for the Spanish American War. The muster roll states he was born in Chelsea MA, was 27 years old at the time of his enlistment (which puts his year of birth about 1871), and Mrs. Daniel P. Frye (sic) of New Haven was his next of kin. This was Dennis' and Mary's oldest son Patrick, although I don't understand the name switch from Pat J. (which is how he's named on his birth record) to Joe P. In addition to the above, the roll states he was 5' 6" in height, of dark complexion, with brown eyes and black hair. His given occupation was machinist, he was a resident of New Haven, and he was single.

Joseph P.'s military experience was not a happy one; in fact, it turned out to be a disaster.

Prior to obtaining his military service record, I learned that the 3rd CT (45 officers and 1,232 enlisted men) was mustered into Federal service 2-6 July 1898 at Niantic CT. It spent time at Camp Meade PA and then at Camp Onward (Savannah GA), mustering out on 20 March 1899 at Savannah GA. Despite the fact it never made it out of the country, it suffered severely. The loss among officers was especially appalling: 16 resigned or were discharged. Of the enlisted men, 8 were transferred, 9 were discharged due to disability, and 15 died of disease. 11 were discharged by general court martial, 92 were discharged by order, and 51 deserted. Obviously, this outfit had a definite discipline/morale problem.

Joseph was absent without leave 17-22 August 1898. A summary court martial fined him \$12 on 23 August. He went AWOL again 2-5 September 1898 and was fined another \$12. He missed roll calls on 12 and 13 September and was fined \$2. He was court martialed under Article 62 (Articles of War) on 22 September and again on 19 October, receiving fines of \$5 and \$4; there's not any specifics, but Article 62 refers to "crimes and disorders to prejudice of military discipline." He was AWOL yet again from 28 October to 14 November. This time he got a \$15 fine and 30 days confinement. On 14 February 1899 he was convicted by a general court martial under articles 33 (absence from parade) and 62 and was sentenced to be dishonorably discharged and to serve six months hard labor at St. Francis Barracks, located in St. Augustine FL. The reviewing authority stated that the prosecution failed to prove time and place of the allegations against Joseph - a "grave irregularity" - but was of the opinion that this was not a "fatal defect" in the government's case, and so approved the sentence. On 18 February, Joseph was given a medical examination; he complained of heart and kidney trouble, which he had first noticed in October 1898 while in the guard house, but didn't know the cause. The examining surgeon's diagnosis was Joseph suffered from rheumatism - "local and trifling" - but this was not a permanent condition nor did it prevent him from performing manual labor. Joseph was escorted from Savannah to St. Francis Barracks, arriving there about 11:30am on 21 February. On 12 April 1899, an order was issued remitting the unserved portion of his confinement, but this was revoked on the 19th. After his release, he evidently did find his way back north; in 1910 he's in New Haven, this time in the County Jail. My mother remembers meeting him: he was very nice but had the air of a rover about him. He didn't marry.
