Notes for Benjamin Kevil 1:

According to Ronald Stephens in his work, "The Descendants of Uriah Stephens and Nancy Kevil, privately published in 1995, "...the family migrated to South Carolina from Virginia, although the date is not known. Records show that Benj. Kivel witnessed the sale of property on June 13, 1774, in Louisa County, Virginia, that son Thomas was living in Virginia in 1790, that daughter Mary married Julius Glazebrook on December 23, 1790, in Campbell County, Virginia, and that son Benjamin married Betsy Akin in Laurens County, South Carolina, probably around 1775-1779...."

More About Benjamin Kevil 1:

Fact #2: Record found in LDS Family Search International Genealogical Index, Film #2034438. Immigration: Abt. 1635, A hand-written account of the Kevil/Keville family by J. E. Kevil said "The Keville family came from Wales to the U.S. two generations before the Rev. War (Revolutionary War) about 1635, having previously gone there from France during the Huguenot War."

Notes for Thomas Kevil:

The Magazine of Virginia Genealogy, Vol. 30, No. 2, pages 88 and 89:

November 10, 1780 - Sundry inhabitants of Cumberland County petitions the House of Delegates to reject a bill forbidding the use of depreciated currency (?) in payment of debts. The substance of the bill is that no paper currency shall remain a tender and pass in payment of debts and contracts as herefore, but that all debts and all loan office tickets be paid in as much money as will purchase such a quantity of tobacco as the money would have purchased at the time the contract was made or the money lent. Signitures were: Thomas Kevil and 185 other residents of Cumberland County, Virginia.

The 1782 Contintental Census of Virginia shows Thomas Keville residing in Cumberland County, Virginia. See page 16, Township 0500, Continental Census, and ID #VAS1a1881063 of the Early Virginia Census Index data base.

6. Deed Book K, page 220B, October 29, 1800. Benjamin Kevil sold 600 acres to William Collins in the Laurens District of South Carolina for 40 pounds Sterling.

When Benjamin Kevil died in 1813 he had a land grant of 900 acres on the Enoree River.

The following is a Bill of Sale from Benjamin Kevil to Mathew Williams found in Will Book I, page 11 of the Robertson County, Tennessee Archives:

"Know all men by these presence that I Benjamin Kevil of the County of Montgomery and State of Tennessee for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Mathew Williams of Robertson County and State aforesaid before the execution of these presence have bargain and sold and delivered unto said Williams one negro woman named Sarah and the said Kevil my heirs and assigns due by these presence warrent and secure the title of the negro Sarah unto the said Matheew Williams his heirs and assigns clear from the lawful claim or demand of any person or persons whatsoever witness my hand and seal this sixth day of March 1797."

Benjamin Kevil and Betsy Kevil, his wife, in 1810, conveyed a tract of land to one Thomas Brooks and Thomas Kevil and Lucretia Kevil were witnesses to the deed.

OTHER FACTS;

In his privately published work, "The Decedents of Uriah Stevens and Nancy Kevil," Ronald Evans notes on Page 31 that "...Benjamin Keville was a soldier in the Revolutionary War, serving in General George Robuck's Regiment during the battle and fall of Charleston, South Carolina. The Roster of the South Carolina Patriots in the American Revolution by Bobby Gilmore Moss shows on Page 532: KEVILLE, BENJAMIN; b. ca 1750/60; d. 1813; m. Betsy Akin; He served in the militia, Benjamin served in Captain Vardry McBee's Company as a Sargent in horses for 335 days from June 10, 1780 to July 1, 1781, and as a private horseman for 19 days from October 17 to November 5, 1781. He was paid 22.5 shillings per day as a Sargent in horses and 20 schillings per day as a private horseman."

When Benjamin Kevil died in 1813, Samuel Glenn was appointed Special Commissioner to divide the Keville homestead, which contained 460 acres, into five equal parts; one boy and three girls, the widow taking a child's part. The deeds to his three daughters were made to their husbands. Thomas Kevil then bought his three sisters out. The girls married Samuel Stephen, Uriah Stephen and Laban Marchbanks. Book A, Page 105, County Clerk's Office, Princeton, Kentucky.

In 1818, Betsy Kevil died and in 1819 Thomas Kevil bought her interest from the other heirs, which gave him the entire 460 acres,

Sgt. Benjamin Kevil lived in Laurens County, South Carolina, and fought with Gen. George Roebuck at the fall of Charleston. After the American Revolution he migrated to Caldwell County, Kentucky about 1796-1797.

At the Kevil Family Cemetery, off the Cadiz Road in Caldwell Co., Kentucky a marker was erected on his grave on June 3, 1977. Excerpt from speech given by Rev. Wendell Hurt at the dedication: "Mr. Kevil found in America something that he liked and something that he felt worth fighting for. He fought with Gen. Roebuck for more than just the land on which he stood. He fought for a dream. A dream which he did not see fully develop, but one he knew would come to full harvest."

In the 1800 U.S. Census Tax lists March 10, 1800, Benjamin Kevil was listed as residing in Livingston County, Kentucky.

The date of his birth and death is established by his military pension records

Number S 16, 831. In his declaration of December 10, 1832, Julius Glazebrook states he was 80 years the 15th day of April last, which would make his birthday April 15, 1752. He was married twice. His first wife was Mary Garton, and his second wife whom he married December 23, 1790 was Mary Keville. Julius and Mary Keville were married in Campbell County, Virginia according to the DAR Patriot Index.

In the DAR Patriot Index, they also show a James Glazebrook born 1739, Richard Glazebrook born April 10, 1753, and a John Glazebrook who was killed in the Revolutionary War. All were from Virginia.

Julius Glazebrook entered the service on June 10, 1780 in the County of Charlotte, Virginia, and was a private and served in the Company of Thomas Williams. He was discharged five months later in the last of November at the Guilford Courthouse in North Carolina. He re-entered the service the second time in July 1781 again from

Charlotte County, Virginia, and served for a term of three months under Colonel Tucker and Matt Richardson. For his pension, he was paid \$26.66 per annum commencing March 1831. The certificate of pension was issued the 10th day of June 1833, and was sent to Gritton, Columbia, Kentucky where he was living at that time. By March 20, 1841, he made a further declaration and was residing in Putnam County, Indiana.

Julius Glazebrook died in Putnam County, Indiana, and there is a monument to the soldiers who served in the American Revolution and his name is among them. He is listed in the 1787 Personal Property Tax of Charlotte County, Virginia, and he had 2 horses and 12 cattle. In the 1790 Census, he

is shown in Charlotte County as head of the family and there was 8 whites living within the home. Julius appears in the 1800 tax list of Lincoln County, Kentucky.

It is believed that the Glazebrooks first came from Madeley, Shropshire, England. Also stated was the area of Nottinghamshire. In "From Bavaria to Baltimore" there is a biography of Annie Lee Glazebrook who was born in Richmond, Virginia in 1884. Her father was Wilber Blackwell Glazebrook, and she traces her pedigree back to Egbert (775f-839) 1st king of England and Charlemagne. In that same book, it refers to Julius as her 5th great-uncle and Richard Glazebrook as her 4th Great-grandfather. In the manuscript Suttons of Carolina County, Virginia, Hawsie Sutton daughter of Hawes R. Sutton married Larkin W. Glazebrook. He was the son of Larkin W. and Rena Roane Glazebrook. Larkin Jr. was born June 16, 1854 and died September 12, 1930. There was a William Glasbrooke who emigrated on August 1, 1635 aboard the Elizabeth of London.

The Pension Roll of 1835, Volume 3, page 267, states that Julius Glazebrook was put on Pension in the County of Casey, Kentucky. He was a Private in the Virginia Militia and his annual allowance was to be 26.66 and he received 66.65. He was placed on the pension roll on July 10, 1833 at the age of 82.

In Tennessee Bible Records and Marriage Bonds, there is a John B. Glazebrook who married Miss Jane L. Green on November 4, 1851. The Minister was Robert Boyte Howell in Richmond, Virginia. In Suttons again, Jane Lipscombe Green married John B. Glazebrook. His will was dated July 8, 1874 in Henrico County, Tennessee. The above Annie Lee is descended from Wilbur Glazebrook son of Jane and John. DAR Application of Vera Cornelia Glazebrook Kenney Natl No 369690 states there

is two other application on file # 327662 aunt of Vera and No 163299 (unknown). In the Kentucky Historical Society, an article about the Glazebrook Family states the Glazebrooks (two brothers) emigrated to America from England and settled in Virginia. An account states that one brother died at sea and they were the sons of Julius.

Richard Glazebrook, the second son of the first Julius had his home in Hanover County, Virginia, 4-5 miles from Ashland and it was called Beargarden. He married Kitty Snead and had John Glazebrook who married Judith Blackwell, Nancy married Benjamin Thomas, Catharine married Billy Davis, Lucy married John Cross, and Richard married Lucy Davis. This ties in with the history found in Suttons.

On a web page maintained by John Shanfelt, it states the same regarding two brothers coming to America with one dying and being buried at sea. He further states that a young girl was kidnapped, taken on board ship and that he fell in love with her and worked to pay her passage and married her.

Early Kentucky Landholders 1787-1811 shows Julius with acreage along Rolling Fork from 1799 to 1806. Lincoln County, Kentucky Records, Volume 3, on October 9, 1798 states that Julius Glazebrook should be summoned because they wanted a road to pass thru his land. On September 9, 1806, the records show Julius Glazebrook was to make appraisal of the personal estate of Gabriel Hutchings, deceased. On December 14, 1807, records show that Julius was appointed executor of estate of James Glazebrook, deceased.

Julius gave consent for his daughter Polly to marry James Brinton on March 15, 1806. It was witnessed by James Glazebrook and Clifton Glazebrook. He also consented on January 23, 1803 for his daughter Elizabeth to marry Jesse Smith. There is a will on file in Barren County, Kentucky, Will Book 1, page 327, of Richard Glazebrook. It was probated April 1816 and names his sister, Elizabeth Frances; brothers, James, John, William, Jorden; and sister Polly. This could be another son or nephew. The will does not mention Clifton. Miscellaneous Deed Abstracts of Charlotte Co. Va shows Julius as Witness to deed found Book 7, page 225 on December 4, 1794. There is also a deed

in Book 6, page 64, on October 5, 1789, they mention Glazebrooks land as a marker. In Book 8, page 21, August 3, 1789, Julius was sworn to the Grand Jury. and again on November 1, 1790, page 10. Also on page 203, March 1, 1792 and again on page 223 on May 1, 1792 he is a member of the grand jury.

Shown residing in Christian County, Kentucky in 1790 Kentucky Census Tax List; and then residing in St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana in the U.S. Census of 1820. His wife, Elizabeth, moved to Ascension Parish, Louisiana where she is shown residing in 1850.

Watkins, curator, as a friend, in the town of Princeton, Kentucky on the 25th day of December next, free from all and every charge whatever.

It is understood that the said Negro is not to work at any Iron or Coaling works, or to be run as a hand or passenger on any steam boat or water mill.

Now in advanced age....being blessed with a sound mind. Debts to be paid. To William H. Kevil in trust for the use and benefit of Alcy H. Hayes and her children, \$800, the money to remain in William's hands until the whole of the \$800 is paid over by my executor as hereafter directed. William paying interest on the amount of sd. legacy that may come into his hands while it remains therein, and also giving bond and security for the faithful discharge of sd. trust. But I have already paid Alcy, a portion of this legacy, which I have receipts for this and whatever I may advance to her of my property before my death is to be deducted out of this \$800. Then William is to purchase with the remainder of this money a piece of land for the use and benifit of Alcy and her children forever, but is in nowise to be sold for her husband's debts. To my son William H. Kevil, \$800, but I have already advanced to him some portion of my property for which I hold the receipts and note. This and whatever advancements I may hereafter make him before my death is to deducted out of this \$800 before it is paid to him. To my son Drury M. Kevil, \$800, but I have already made some advancements which I hold his receipts. These and whatever advancements I may make to him out of my property before my death is to be deducted out of this \$800 before it is paid to him. I direct that the foregoing legacys to Alcy H. Hayes, William H. Kevil and Drury M. Kevil be paid to them in equal installments in and (sic) two years after my death after deducting the advancements. My executor may sell as much of the loose property that can be most conveniently spared for the purpose of paying my debts and the above legacys. To my beloved wife, all the land (including the houses) lying on the south side of the road running by my house, the same that I now live on; also 115 acres of the Asenbangh tract commencing on my line next to Urey's land and running with Urey's line until it comes opposite Macy Bond's field, running down with sd. field fence nearly opposite her house, when I shall make a corner, thence commencing on a white oak corner of my old survey, thence running up the creek far enough to make the 115 acres. This is intended to give my wife timber enough to support the old place. This land my wife is to have during her life. This land, 115 acres, I value at \$4 per acre, and the old place at \$12 per acre; the old place my wife is to have during her life also. My wife shall have as much during her life of the household and kitchen furniture, horse, cattle, sheep, hogs and farming utensils that she may need, she being the judge, for her support and to carry on the farm. Also give to my wife, half of all my negroes, such as she may choose, including those that I have in the possession of my children, but the negroes I gave to my children, she is not to take from them. Those negroes my wife is to have during her life, but if she should marry, she is not to have the one half of the negroes as above stated, but is to take one third of the negroes that is in my possession at my death. During her life she is to have such negroes as she may chooseto make one third. To my daughter, Neicy Francis Jones Kevil, at my wife's death, the above mentioned portion of land I have given my wife; also negro girl Martha, at the price of \$650, and then is to be paid to her in money enough to make her equal to James, Mary Ann and Macy in the negroes I have given them. In case negro Martha should die before Neicy should arrive at the age of 21 years, James E. Kevil, Mary Ann Rice (formerly Kevil) and Mary N. Bond (formerly Kevil) shall furnish Neicy with a negro of equal value with Martha. The land I give to Neicy at my wife's death I vlaue at 115 of the Asenbaugh tract at \$4 per acre and the old place at \$10 per acre. To my son, James E. Kevil, the tract of land he now lives on, the same I purchased of Jonathan Ruker, above 170 acres; also the 39 acres, same I purchased of Tunis Dyer. I give him these lands at theprice mentioned in the deeds to same, but not to be less than \$1400. This land he is to take at the above price as a portion of my estate; also give him the negro boy Allen now in his possession, at the price of \$900. To my daughter Macy N. Bond, all the remainder of the Asenbaugh tract of land that she now lives on, except the portion already willed to my wife; also all of my old tract of land on the north side of the old road leading by my house, the Asenbaugh's place, at the price of \$4 per acre and the portion of the old place at \$2 per acre; also negro woman Reemy and her child Bob, at the price of \$900. To my daughter Mary Ann Rice, the tract of land she now lives on, the same I purchased of Tunis Dyer, containing about 207

acres, at the price of \$1500, the same the deal calls for; also one negro woman Betsy and her child Silas, at the price of \$900. To the heirs, if any, of my deceased son Manson Kevil, \$1. This is all sd. heirs, if any, shall have of my estate in any way, either in law or Equity. All property that is not willed away at my death shall be equally divided amongst my four children, to wit James E. Kevil, Macy N. Bond (formerly Kevil), Mary Ann Rice (formerly Kevil) and Neicy Francis Jones Kevil. In case any of the Asenbaugh place should be taken away from my daughter, Macy, my other heirs should make up to her the amount of the loss, to wit James and Mary N.; also they are to make up any loss that may be in the possession given to my wife. My executor is to sell and make deeds to any land I have in Hopkins Co. At my wife's death, all the property that she may died possessed of to be equally divided between my four children, James E. Kevil, Macy Bond, Mary A. Rice and Neicy Francis Jones Kevil, to be for the use of them and her heirs, but in no event to be taken to pay their husband's debts. My daughter Neicy Francis Jones Kevil holds a note to me, dated this day for \$179.80, and due one day after this date. I direct my executors to pay my daughter sd. note with interest at my death. Appoint my son James E. Kevil and my son in law Noah Rice executors. signed: Thos. Kevil. Wit: F. W. Urey, Thomas S. Johnson, H. J. Evans, T. L. McNary. In accordance with the judgment Circuit Court in the action of Kevil's heirs, hereby certify the foregoing will of Thomas Kevil dec'd to the clerk of Caldwell County Court for Record 8 Jan 1867. signed: J. Section 46 was 269 acres and Section 43 was 369 acres laid out along the Tangipahoa River. They lived on property located near Mt. Stevens and Stevens (Tycar Road) Cemeteries east of Tickfaw, Louisiana - lying between LA Route 1065 and the Tangipahoa River. Following the death of Uriah and Nancy Stevens, the estate was composed of 1519 acres - all but 640 acres were sold by a sheriff's sale to settle the estate for the heirs.

"Uriah Stevens died on October 21, 1855, probably of typhoid fever, as this was noted by the attending physician to have been the cause of death of his sons, John Benjamin and Calvin. They are believed to be buried in the old Stevens Cemetery located on Tycker Road east of Tickfaw, Louisiana, and a grave marker has been installed there for them."

LABAN MARCHBANKS To MOSES MOORE JOHNSTON MARCHBANKS, on 12th August 1837, ratifies a sale of four (4) slaves made by LABAN MARCHBANKS to MOSES MOORE on "the eleventh instant" (11th August 1837) for \$1,200.00. The slaves were inherited by Laban from his mother's estate. This Sale is recorded on 26th October 1837. The slaves were described in the sale as :

Dice, aged about 24 years, and her three children, Isaac, a boy about nine years of age, Adeline, a girl about six years of age, and Anthony, a boy about one year of age.

Ronald Evans' book on page 295, "The Decedents of Uriah Stevens and Nancy Kevil" notes that "...in 1848 Laban Marchbanks sold the rest of the estate (500 acres in St. Tammany/Tangipahoa Parish) to Benjamin Lanier. This latter document reserved a graveyard site, approximately 25-feet square." Documents found indicate that "...his father, Johnson Marchbanks, was dead only a few days after his sale of property to Alex Kincaid. The parents are probably buried in the graveyard mentioned in the 1848 document. Laban moved to Ascension Parish, and was an Election Commissioner for the New River Precinct of Ascension Parish in January 1846.

EXCERPTS FROM HIS OBITUARY: 1898

Mr. James E. Kevil, one of the best known men of Princeton or Caldwell County, died at his

residence in this city on Wednesday morning just before the noon hour, of stomach and heart trouble.

He was born November 28, 1822, and grew to manhood on the old Kevil homestead, two miles south of Princeton.

He was a good man in all the word implies - as a citizen, as a Christian and in the home circle, and exerted a good influence in religious and moral movements.

Mr. Kevil was an active church worker and was a leading spirit in the Methodist Church. He was converted in 1844, and shortly afterwards he and his father began the organization and building a church at Rock Springs, in this county, which is now a tower of Methodism in Western Kentucky.

The Kevil family emigrated to Kentucky in the early part of this century and braved the dangers and hardships incident to pioneer life. They were known for their sturdy honesty and strict integrity and this characteristic was well marked and known in James E. Kevil. His word was his bond, his acts a crown of business honor.

EX-MAYOR M. R. KEVIL

Claimed By Death - Funeral Here Sunday Largely Attended.

"There's a garden of light full of Heaven's perfumes,
Where never a tear drop is shed;
Where the rose and the lilly are ever in bloom -
'Tis the beautif land of the dead."

In the passing of M. R. Kevil, which occurred at Carnegie, Penn., Friday, May 20th, Princeton loses one of her best loved and finest citizens, for this city still claimed Mr. Kevil as her own, although he has for the past few years, made his residence in other communities. The word "Princeton" meant "home" to him and he hoped to make his abode here when his temporary work in the north was over.

Mr. Kevil had been in failing health since the first of the year, but had been able to be about his work until just a few days before his death, the immediate cause od which was angina pectoris. Physicians had informed his loved ones of the gravity of his condition, but despite this fact the passing was a great shock. The remains were brought here and conveyed to the family residence , the impressive funeral service being conducted there by Rev. James T. Rushing, Sunday afternoon, and interment following at Cedar Hill Cemetery; the beautiful ritual of the Elk Lodge being used.

Mathew Rice Kevil was the son of James E. and Nancy Bell Kevil who were pioneer residents. He was a representative of one of the county's oldest families, and was one of a family of ten children, eight sons and two daughters, only two of whom survive, he was sixty-four years of age and had spent most of his life in this city and county. Twenty years ago he was happily united in marriage to Mrs. Grace Lyon Beeler, who with two brothers, A. B. Kevil of Rockport, Kentucky, and J. E. Kevil of Colorado survive. In her early youth, a neice, Miss Rosalind Roach was taken into the Kevil home, where she found the love and tenderness accorded a daughter, and to her, as well as the bereaved widow and brothers, our sympathy is extended.

The deceased has been identified with the business interests of this city for many years, and few men have enjoyed a more enviable reputation for ability and general popularity than he. For twenty years

he was connected with the Princeton Shoe Company , for sixteen years as its owner. He served the city well in the capacity of Mayor, and was a man of commendable public ability. After severing his connection with the Shoe Store, Mr. Kevil took up road building which vocation he followed for several years. In 1924 he was appointed receiver for banks that had failed, and in a short time developed a comprehensive knowledge of the science of banking and its practical working. He had satisfactorily wound up the affairs of banks at Bluffton and Springfield, Ohio, and at Beaver, Waynesbury and Carnegie, Penn., the latter city being his place of residence for the past year.

Mr. Kevil was a consistant member of the Central Presbyterian Church of which he had been a communicant for several years. His friends were in all walks of life, amoung both young and old and his passing away has caused community wide regret.

Her home and family were enriched by the interest and experience gained through all these activities and the memory of the hospitality of her home where taste and influence were so evident, will ever linger in the hearts of her friends.

PRINCETON DEAN OF MUSIC DIES SUNDAY MORNING

Mrs. Grace Kevil Victim of Paralytic Stroke - Funeral Today

"In Heaven a spirit doth dwell whose heartstrings are a lute" - Koran.

Mrs. M. R. Kevil died in her home on East Market Street Sunday morning Feb. 6, 1938 after a few days illness. She had not been well for several months and last Wednesday, following a slight paralytic stroke, her condition became precarious as was immediately recognized by her family physician, Dr. W. L. Cash and the devoted members of her household.

The whole community was overshadowed by a deep sense of loss and profound bereavement when

it became generally known, that in the tranquil hours preceeding the Sabbath dawning, the angel of the Amaranthine Crown had summond her spirit to where the stars sing eternally together, the music of the spheres.

Mrs. Kevil had lived in this community for many years and perhaps had wielded more influence for culture and refinement among the young people of this city for a longer period of time, than any other one resident. She had conducted a studio for the instruction of piano pupils here for years, her average advanced pupils were outstanding in talent and many had achieved marked success. "Miss Grace" was dean of music instructors in this community, a woman whose very life was engrossed by the art she loved; and who lavishly shared that art with the public. The place she occupied in the hearts and lives of this citizenry will be difficult to fill, her loss to the community well nigh irreparable.

Mrs. Grace Lyon Kevil was a daughter of distinguished ancestry. She was the oldest child of General Hylan Benton Lyon of the army of the Confederate States of America, and Mrs. Grace Machen Lyon. She was born January 20, 1871. She was united in marriage to the late Tom Beeler of this place, and they were the parents of two children who died in infancy. The young couple made their home here on Washington Street in The residence now occupied by Mr. Henry Towery and family. This ideal union was soon severed by death, and after a number of years Mrs. Beeler was married to Matthew R. Kevil, prominent merchant and financier, a former mayor of Princeton. Mr. Kevil preceeded her in death some eleven years ago. Into their home and hearts came a motherless child, the former Miss Rosalyn Roach, niece of Mr. Kevil who reciprocated their love by a devotion and attention that was truely fillal. Besides this foster child, she is survived by two brothers, Captain Frank Lyon of the United States Navy of Charlottesville, Va., who at one time was a resident of this place; Ernest Lyon of Eddysville; two half sisters, Mrs. Lawson Faxon of Hopkinsville; Loraine Lyon and stepmother Mrs. Ruth W. Lyon of Eddyville; and an uncle, Mr. Frank Machen of Princeton.

Mrs. Kevil never abandoned her studies, keeping up with modern ideas in teaching; only two years ago she spent the summer in Europe working with the greatest masters of the Old World. She was prominent in the church, civic, club and social circles, and was never too occupied in her busy life to contribute her valuable time to arranging for her talented pupils to share in many of the community musical programs. Year after year, her finished musicians went forth to give pleasure and culture to the musical world. Several of her pupils studied abroad, one winning a scholarship that took her to Fontainebleau, near Paris, France as a student. As an accompanist, she was without a peer, truely it might be written of her that like Israfell, her "heart strings were a lute." While teaching was her profession yet she gave generously to many children who possibly could not otherwise have had the fine advantages of piano study; gave quietly and in secret without expectation of reward except in seeing her pupils' attainment in the arts they both loved. Mrs. Kevil was organist of the Central Presbyterian Church for many years. This cherished duty she had relinquished of late to one of her talented young pupils, only playing on very special occasions. She held membership in the Gradatim Club, oldest study organization in the city, and the United Daughters of the Confederacy.

Sunday morning, the remains were conveyed to the Morgan Funeral Home on South Seminary Street to await obsequies and there those in all walks of life came to shed a quiet tear of farewell. Funeral services took place at the family residence this (Tuesday) morning at ten o'clock; the Rev. E. E. Diggs, Jr., her pastor saying the eloquent and well deserved tribute. Internment followed in the sequestered confines of Cedar Hill Cemetery.

Mrs. Kevil will live long in the hearts of those she leaves behind. "Grace," given by her parents at birth was no misnomer for she was gracious of personality. Her gentle dignity and noble character enhancing her worth as a mentor in the field of labor to which she had so definetly dedicated her time and talents.

B. J. SPRATT, Caldwell County, is a native of Garrard County, Ky., and is a son of John and Sophia Spratt. He was born September 3, 1824, and is the sixth of a family of seven children, as follows: H. D., deceased; John T., deceased; Margaret; William S.; Elizabeth, deceased; Martha L., deceased; and subject. The paternal grandfather of subject was a native of Virginia and an early pioneer of Lincoln County, Ky., where he died. John Spratt was born in Virginia, was a farmer, and died in September 1880. Mrs. Spratt, subject's mother, was a daughter of A. J. Brown, a pioneer of Garrard County, who died in 1833 at an advanced age. Mrs. Spratt died in 1853. The subject of this sketch, at the age of twenty years, left the paternal roof and commenced learning the cabinet trade in Princeton with Coon & Anderson, with whom he remained three years. At the end of that time he enlisted in Company G, Fourth Kentucky Regiment, for the Mexican War, and served throughout that struggle. He then returned to Princeton, where he worked at his trade until 1852, when he joined R. B. Snelling's company of gold seekers, and made the overland trip to California, where he remained until 1855, mining and prospecting in the meantime. In 1855 he located near the mouth of Rogue River, Ore., where he remained until the breaking out of the Indian War, which broke up the settlement. With 105 other citizens he fled to a hastily constructed fort for safety. This fort stood at the present site of Ellensburg, and afforded the settlers protection from the foe twenty-three days, during which eight of the defenders fell. At the close of the trouble Mr. Spratt joined the command of Capt. Rynerson, and assisted in removing the tribe of Rogue River Indians to their reservation on Silette River. There he found employment as a carpenter and builder on the fort in King's Valley under Lieut. Philip Sheridan, now lieutenant-general of the United States Army, and remained with the command until the spring of 1857, when he returned, via the Isthmus of Panama, to Caldwell County, and purchased the farm on which he now resides. Mr. Spratt was married in 1848 to Mary Jane Chambers, daughter

of W. P. Chambers, by whom he had two children: John F., and Jeannette, wife of J. K. McGoodwin, of Princeton. Mrs. Spratt died in 1860, aged thirty years. WESTERN KENTUCKY

R. U. KEVIL

R. U. Kevil, one of the native sons of Caldwell County, Kentucky, has been a prominent citizen, farmer, and business man of the same for a number of years, and few enjoy a better reputation for ability and general popularity than he. He was born on a farm on August 28, 1845, and represents one of the oldest families in the county. His great-grandfather, of Scotch decent, came from North

Carolina to Kentucky as a pioneer, when all the country was wild and abounding with Indians and wild animals. His son Thomas was born in North Carolina and was but a child when he was brought to Caldwell County. He was a farmer by occupation, and died on the farm which he had been reared.

James E. Kevil, the father of R. U. Kevil, was born in Caldwell County about 1822, and passed all his life there, living to the age of seventy-six years. He married Nancy Bell, who was born in Ireland and came to America with her mother when sixteen years old. She is still living at the age of seventy-eight years, and has been the mother of ten children, eight sons and two daughters, all of whom reached their majority and seven are still living.

R. U. Kevil, the second child and son, was reared on the farm, where he was taught the value of independent and honest toil, and received a common school education. He remained at home until his marriage on July 19, 1865, when Miss Laura Holloway became his bride. She was born in Lyon County, Kentucky, a daughter of Robert and Catherine (Boyd) Holloway, and was reared in her native county. Mr. and Mrs. Kevil have six children: J. R.; Alva, wife of W. H. Patrick, of Evansville, Indiana; Laban; Catherine, wife of Charles S. Thomas, a prominent business man of Chicago; Birdie, wife of George Pettit, Jr., of Princeton; and J. U., of Franklin, Indiana.

After his marriage, Mr. Kevil located on a farm in Caldwell County, and afterward bought the old homestead, where he was engaged in farming and stock-raising. At the same time, he was interested in milling, having built a mill in Trigg County in 1871 and owning a share in it. He sold this in 1875, and bought an interest in the Banner Mill in Princeton. He disposed of this in 1883, and then purchased the Princeton Roller Mills, which he has successfully conducting ever since. He tore down the old mill in 1885 and rebuilt an entirely new and modern plant, equipped with all the up-to-date contrivances and machinery, and to show how progressive he is, he again remodeled and rebuilt it in 1895, having a mill of two hundred barrels' daily capacity and perfect in all its departments. It is the largest mill in the county, and has a large trade in all directions. Mr. Kevil has a farm in Ballard County, Kentucky, on which a town has been established and named Kevil in his honor. It is located on the Illinois Central Railroad, and is a growing place. He also owns a plantation of seven hundred acres on the Illinois Central in Tallahatchie County, Mississippi, and in Caldwell County has a fine farm of two hundred and sixty-eight acres, one of the finest in the county. All this indicates how successful he has been in his business operations, and it is the more creditable because he has won it all by his own efforts, studious attention to business, and good and diligent management.

Mr. Kevil has been a life-long Democrat, and was a private soldier under General Forrest during the war of the Rebellion. He is a prominent Royal Arch Mason, and in every relation that he has with society in general is influential and progressive and held in universal esteem. The Kevil's have resided in this part of Kentucky for over a hundred years, and they are well known all over western Kentucky.

Excerpts from the Paducah Sun-Democrat in 1949:

48-Year Old Kevil Is Progressive Farm Center Caldwell Man Starts Town On Way In Wake Of Railroad Plan

Kevil, Ky., Jan. 15 - The bearded giant of a man drew a square on the ground with a stick, and then he scraped a heavy line through the center of the box. He studied the pattern for a long time before turning slowly to study the land around him.

He was standing in a field covered with tall grass and bushes. A house or two could be seen through the trees and a country road, splitting the fields nearby, disappeared over a hill to the west.

The well-dressed man nodded his head in approval of an idea he had, then walked briskly to his buggy and drove away.

It was the spring of 1901. The big man, nearly six and a half feet tall, was R. U. Kevil, an enterprising business man from Princeton. The heavy line in the box was an imaginary railroad that turned to steel less than two years later, and the box was a miniature outline of what is now Kevil, Ballard County town that grew up quickly as a shipping point along the new railroad line.

R. U. Kevil Awake

Mr. Kevil was following his usual practice of keeping wide awake in all business matters. He had made it a point to find out about the railroad survey, made in 1901, and by the time he visited the field the following spring he was familiar with what was going to happen. So in the summer of 1901, when the railroad was under construction and a public improvement company had platted the town and was holding a lot of auction, Mr. Kevil's towering frame was pushed to the auction platform. His voice thundered offer after offer, and over and over again the auctioneer chanted: "Sold to R. U. Kevil."

The people of new Kevil must have been grateful to Mr. Kevil for the part he played in getting the town on its way, for they named the town after him.

Train Rolls

The first train ran over the railroad August 16, 1903, and Kevil mushroomed almost overnight, as other people followed Mr. Kevil's lead. Charles Burnley built the first house. Mr. Burnley also built the first business place - a somewhat drab establishment where coffins were built. In 1904, the Post Office opened with Bob Russell as Postmaster, and his office supplied all other offices in Ballard County with postal supplies.

Town Takes Shape

Four brick buildings were constructed in 1903 and 1904. They were occupied by the Kevil Improvement Company, the Kevil Bank, Nuckols Drug Store and the Kevil School. The hotel did a prosperous business under management of Mr. and Mrs. Bob Stewart.

School Founded In 1903

The school was organized in 1903. The Kevil Improvement Company, promoted by Mr. Kevil and leading citizens, donated the land. A man named Copeland and Mrs. Carrie Stephens were the first teachers. Trustees levied the school tax and hired a man to collect revenue.

After that, the funds were to be distributed to a variety of charitable and religious organizations.

The largest bequest, \$300,000, will be used by the J. U. Kevil Memorial Foundation to establish a

center for helping the mentally ill and retarded of Mayfield and Graves County. The four downtown churches of downtown Mayfield - First Presbyterian, First Methodist, First Baptist, and First Christian - received \$75,000 each. Five bequests of \$10,000 each went to orphanages. Another \$40,000 went to establish a scholarship loan fund at Murry State College. Gifts of \$3,576.83 each went to 25 churches. The only one outside Graves County went to the Ogden Memorial Methodist Church in Princeton, where Mr. Kevil was born.

He was former director of First National Bank of that city, past president of the Mayfield Loose Leaf Floors and the Tobacco Board of Trade, a staunch member of the First Presbyterian Church, and affiliated with several National Lodge fraternities.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Jennie Wire Kevil; two sisters, Mrs. A. A. Eastland, this city, Mrs. Alva Patrick, Clinton, Ky., a nephew, Urey Patrick of Clinton, also several nieces and nephews of this place who share in the bereavement.

Mr. Kevil was a cousin of Gov. Keen Johnson of Kentucky, and was closely associated with the state administration. His business activities were widespread in Western Kentucky, and he was well known for his acts of charity and kindness.

All friends of Mrs. Kevil are invited to attend.

Hosting the affair will be Mrs. W. H. Gentry, Mrs. Sid Wyrick, and Mrs. Keith St. John, all members of her family.

She was born Feb. 27, 1877, in Lyon County, KY., and then married J. U. Kevil in 1901 at Lyon County. Kevil died in 1945.

Mrs. Kevil has been a resident of Carlsbad for 26 years, coming here from Texas where she and her husband had farmed.

Her son, A. M. Kevil, Carlsbad said of his mother, "Hard work won't kill a person. She worked in the fields and did a lot of work when she was young."

Mrs. Kevil has been an active person all her life, but members of her family were shocked when they found her picking peaches from a ladder at the age of 85.

That same year, Mrs. Kevil boarded her first airplane and made a trip to Kentucky to see her sister and brother. "I can't say I got excited," she said. "Getting ready to go was exciting. I forgot my best dress."

In her young married life, Mrs. Kevil was often called on by her friends and neighbors to help the doctor in the delivery of babies. She said she had helped to deliver 25 to 30 babies. "Day or night, I'd go. I would have everything ready: hot water, baby clothes, when the doctor got there."

Mrs. Kevil was also asked to help prepare people for burial in the early days when the dead were viewed at home prior to the funeral and burial.

One night when Mrs. Kevil was summoned by a neighbor to help with a sick women, they were stopped by the Night Riders. "We had to go through a big gate. Just about the time I got to the house, the man was stopped. He had to explain everything and why we were out. The Night Riders let him pass," she said. "If you didn't have a good excuse, the Night Riders would keep you and sometimes do harm to you."

"They were an outlaw group of tobacco farmers in Kentucky who tried to hold the set price of tobacco. If a farmer sold his tobacco under the set price, sometimes the Night Riders would burn his barn and do other damage," her son explained.

"The Night Riders went from that to personal grudges. They were an outlaw group similar to the Klu Klux Klan."

"It was hard to find a prominent man who was not a member for protection reasons. His father was not a member," his son said.

Times were hard and Mrs. Kevil once crocheted a bedspread from wrapping twine. She liked to use her hands and still crochets some.

Mrs. Kevil has been a member of the Church of Christ since she was 75 years old.

She regrets not being able to help people anymore and misses being around young people.

In reference to raising her family, Mrs. Kevil said she tried to teach them to understand that they have to mind her. "I don't think parents ought to turn children loose to do as they want to do. I don't say that I raised mine perfect."

She had three children of her own, A. M. Kevil, and Mrs. W. H. Gentry, both of Carlsbad, and Mrs. Tom Willis, now deceased. She raised four of her grandchildren when her daughter died. She has a total of 12 grandchildren, 16 great-grandchildren, and one great-great-grandchild.

Her son remembers the time back in 1918 when they were leaving Kentucky to move to Texas, his grandmother was crying. He asked why she was crying and she told him, "You know your mother has tuberculosis and can't live long." He chuckled. She has lived to be 95.

EXCERPTS FROM OBITUARY: 1927 J. R. KEVIL

Mr. Kevil had been a semi-invalid for several years, being the victim of paralysis, and it was this disease that was the indirect cause of his death. The efforts of medical skill and the tender ministrations of loving hands proved unavailing to stay the advance of the Grim Reaper.

Mr. Kevil was a son of one of the county's pioneer families - they were builders, constructive citizens, who contributed largely to the community's progress. In his beautiful suburban home the lavish customs of the plantation owners of past days are observed.

By his death Princeton loses a valuable citizen. He was an indulgent father and was most charitable to those less fortunate than himself, his name being clearly written in the book of gold as one of those "who loved his fellowman".

On November 30, 1927, J. R. Kevil's estate was appraised by R. E. Butler, Clyde C. Johnson, and H. A. Goodwon. He owned 371 acres of land, valued at \$22,800, stock valued at \$119,095, bad debts of \$1,510, and he owned three buildings downtown, livestock, machinery, two trucks, one car, and

accounts receivable at the mill.

ANECDOTES:

He owned Kevil and Wylie Drug Store (in Princeton). J. R. Kevil was quite a hunter, and during quail season (no limit to birds then) he would string quail over and on both sides of the front door of his Drug Store. His friends and towns people would cut off as many as they wanted to take home for a delicious repast.

In 1918, he ordered a Special Paige Essex - model 6-55, car no. 76656, motor no. 75630, from H. & T. Auto Co. in Cincinnati, Ohio. The price of the car was \$1842.16 plus \$54.85 for an extra tire and tube. It was delivered to him on May 16, 1918.

Mr. Kevil operated a flour mill, which was founded by his father, - he owned a jewelry store, dry goods store and drug store and was an optician, but his greatest pleasure was the success he obtained in agriculture. The mill marketed flour as "Kevil's Patent", "Kevil's Best" and "Kevil's S. R."

In 1893, J. R. Kevil was elected the first mayor of Princeton, Kentucky. He served in that capacity for 8 years and in 1899 a new City Hall was built, for a cost of \$1780.

On December 10, 1930, J. R. Kevil ordered 1 dozen china service plates from Marshall Field & Company in Chicago, Illinois. - the cost was \$27.00.

He was baptized in the Methodist Church by Rev. James T. Rushing.

When the flu epidemic took the lives of six of the Kelly children (their parents were tenants on J. R. Kevil's farm), Mr. Kevil paid for their funerals at Morgan's Funeral Home in Princeton, Kentucky.

Prior to her death, Ms. Garrett, who never married, set-up a trust for the Adsmore Museum, and willed her home to the museum to help preserve the history of Princeton and Caldwell County, Kentucky.

The advertising brochure states the following: "When you open the lace panelled doors and step into the spacious hallways and rooms of Adsmore, built in 1857, you will enjoy the fantasy of being able to step back in time to the turn of the last century, and relive the legacy and lifestyle of a prominent western Kentucky family.

John Parker Smith bought the big brick house on North Jefferson Street in 1900, and with the addition of the classical columned portico and a number of Federal touches, added to the fabled mansion and the residence was called Adsmore. Grown children came back to live and frequently visit, making it their Kentucky home - far from the other homes in St. Louis, Washington, D. C., and Rawlins, Wyoming.

Katharine Garrett, grand daughter of John Parker and Nancy Kevil (Nannie) Smith grew up in this home with her mother and father, Mayme and Robert Garrett, and continued to live here all her life. Before her death, she willed that her family estate be left to the George Coon Library as a museum. Today, it provides a retrospective glimpse at a time before automobiles filled the streets around the square in this prosperous town of Princeton, Kentucky.

The rooms have heard the ordinary sounds of evening around the gramophone; have known many happy family reunions; and have seen the wedding of one of the Smith daughters to a prominent western statesman. The walls have witnessed a dozen funerals in the parlor, as well as quite visits by statesmen from the nation's capitol.

Now restored to it's late Victorian beauty, they welcome you to a visit. Come enjoy the home, not only for its architectural charm, but for it's past with a presence that changes with the seasons of the year."

He was active in the Democratic Party, and became the third elected Governor of Wyoming. While on a cruise around the world with some fellow MD's, he met Selina Smith who was traveling with her parents to see Rome, the Egyptian pyramids, and the Holy Land. John Osborne became infatuated with the much younger Selina Smith, and asked permission to leave the doctors trip, and join Selina Smith and her family on their tour. Selina Smith's parents agreed but weren't very happy about the new relationship because Osborne was almost 30 years older than Selina. After the tour, Osborne made several trips to Princeton, Kentucky to see Selina Smith, and they were married in Princeton. Due to the age difference, it was a local scandal, and all the Princeton elite gossiped about it.

Charles (Chuck) Kevil, age 25, shot and instantly killed himself at his home on South Seminary Street last night about 11:15 o'clock. Details obtained today concerning the deplorable event fail to reveal whether the shooting was accidental or intentional.

KEVIL, who was accompanied by his wife, Elizabeth Mann KEVIL and baby daughter, had just driven into the driveway at their home on returning from town when the shooting occurred.

Mrs. KEVIL, with baby in her arms had gotten out of the car on one side and Mr. KEVIL had opened the other door supposedly prepared to step out after taking a twenty-five calibre automatic from the dash compartment when the three shots were fired. All three slugs struck the young man full in the left breast, and he toppled from the car, dying a few minutes later after being removed to the house by neighbors who were summoned by his wife. He was a member of one of Princeton's most prominent families being a son of Mrs. and the late J. R. KEVIL, and a grandson of the late George PETTIT and R. Urey KEVIL. He was one of the city's prominent young business men having for the past several years operated the KEVIL Milling Company.

He is survived by his wife, a daughter, his mother, Mrs. J. P. KEVIL. Three brothers, Pettit, Galveston, Texas, Robert and Ralph of this city, and four sisters, Mrs. John MORGAN, Katherine, who is attending Stephens College at Columbia, Missouri; Mrs. L. H.
