#### THE FAMILY OF EGLE'

The family of EGLE, or EGLI, belonged to the ancient German tribe of Langebards (Longbeards), which settled in the northern part of Italy in the fourth or fifth century. The ancestor of the Swiss Egli's emigrated from the Canton Tessino to St. Gall, about the twelfth century. This ancestor had five sons, three of whom settled in the department of the Loire, in France, subsequently, upon the revocation of the Edict of Nantes, removing to the Canton of Zurich, where they became followers of the Swiss reformer, Zwingli, whilst the other two remained in the Canton of St. Gall. A branch of the latter, somewhat later, emigrated to the Canton of Lucerne. The St. Gall and Lucerne families adhered to the Roman Catholic faith, but a friendly relation with the Zurich branch was constantly maintained. It is more than probable that some one of the same family reached England at an early period, for we find that in the seventh year of the reign of Edward I. (A.D. 1278), "Wilhelmus Egle et Custancia uxor," had holdings in the Hundred of Northstowe, county of Cambridge. The English family of Eagle is different in its origin. The orthography of the name is somewhat perplexing, from the fact that Egle is that adopted by the Zurich branch, while that of Egly by those of St. Gall. Although the first settlers in America wrote their name Egle, there are changes in different sections of the Union, chiefly due to ignorance or carelessness. The New York and Central Pennsylvania families write it correctly, EGLE; those in Ohio, Illinois and Arkansas, EAGLE; while in the Southern states it is EGLEY or EAGLEY, and in California, EKEL, all having the same origin- -descendants of Marcus Egle. In the genealogy which is herewith presented, we have given the uniform spelling EGLE.

MARCUS EGLE, the first of the name in Pennsylvania, was born about the year 1690, in the Canton of Zurich, Switzerland, not far from the city of Berne, from whence he and his family emigrated to America prior to 1740. He took up a tract of land in Cocalico township, Lancaster county, Pa., where he died in September, 1767, leaving a wife, Elizabeth, and five children. We have the names of only four.

Susannah Egle (Eagle) married Col. Phillip Cole, who, prior to the Revolution, settled in Buffalo Valley, PA., and owned the tract of land upon which the town of Hartleton, Union county, is located. He was quite prominent during the early part of the war for independence, but in the "Great Runaway," left the valley, and was residing after the war at York, PA., subsequently it is thought removing to Baltimore, MD. Nothing further is known.

John Egle (Eagle) seems to have been a person of means; was a storekeeper at New Providence, Philadelphia (subsequently Montgomery) county, PA. from 1750 to 1763, afterwards, in 1772, residing in Alsace township, Berks county, and, at the time of his death in 1796, at Reading. His will, which was probated May 6, 1796, makes Reverend William Boas executor, the witnesses being John Spyker and Jacob Dick. His wife Rosina Dick had died prior to him.

CASPAR EGLE (EAGLE) was brought up on his father's farm, a winegrower; received a good education, and with the other members of his family, came to America prior to 1740. His father, as before stated, located in Cocalico township, Lancaster county, PA. but the son settled in Alsace township, Berks county. He was naturalized in October, 1762, as appears by the Pennsylvania Archives. In 1770, he was engaged in merchandising at Reading, while in 1774 he established a brewery at Lancaster. He took the oath of allegiance August 24, 1777. He remained in Lancaster until 1794, when he and his second wife, Catharine Bintling removed to Harrisburg, PA., where they both died at the residence of his son, Valentine.

James Eagle, the eldest child of Joseph Eagle, was eighteen years old when he left No. Carolina for Tennessee, where he lived ten years. Coming to Arkansas in 1839, he first located in Pulaski County, now Lonoke, Lonoke Co., Arkansas, about twenty miles northeast of Little Rock, and there opened up a farm, which he followed all his life with success. During the Civil War he went to Texas as a refugee, and died near Austin, TX in the fall of 1863. James Eagle was a man of remarkable energy and perseverance, as was illustrated by his career through life. He started a poor man, but by using good judgment in his financial transactions and stock deals, slowly built up a competence and then a fortune. At the opening of the Civil War he owned about thirty slaves, besides valuable farms, stock and other property, and was one of the most substantial men in this section of the country.

## The Ashley Township Tragedy

Further particulars on the deliberate murder of a Constable's posse.

The Hon. James P. Eagle, representative from Lonoke County, Sheriff McClintock, Mr. A. Martin, and several other parties from Lonoke, Arkansas, arrived in the city last evening on a hand-car from Lonoke. From these gentlemen we learn the following particulars of the terrible tragedy recorded in yesterday's Gazette.

On Wednesday last George Alexander "Dock" Eagle, his son William H. "Billy" Eagle, his nephew Robert J. Eagle (brother of Hon. James P. Eagle), Dock Gray and James Sullivan were bear hunting. Having lost part of their dogs they came near the Shall place in Pulaski County, Arkansas looking for them. Dock Eagle, Gray, and Robert Eagle went into camp leaving Sullivan and Billy Eagle to hunt the missing dogs. While looking for them, the two latter, in the woods near the Forbes place, came across two negroes with guns, having four hogs tied on their horses. They halted the negroes and told them they desired to see whose hogs they had. The negroes refused to stop. Sullivan and Billy Eagle then advanced on them when the negroes jumped from their horses and took to the brush. They then took charge of the horses and hogs and carried them to the house of Squire Sullivan, a few miles distant. On examination the hogs proved to be in Squire Sullivan's mark. The Squire issued writs for the arrest of the two negroes and there being no constable in the township gave them to Robert J. Eagle to serve on Thursday morning. The latter deputized the party who had been hunting together, Dock Eagle, Dock Gray, James Sullivan and Billy Eagle to assist him in serving the writs. They went to the Forbes place, and arriving there found a company of negroes fully armed. On telling the negroes what they came for, they answered they could not be arrested with five hundred men.

Robert J. Eagle, the acting constable, and who had the writs ordered his posse to dismount. As they did so they were fired upon by a lot of negroes concealed in the crib killing instantly Dock Eagle, his son Billy Eagle and Robert J. Eagle his nephew and severely wounding Sullivan. Dock Gray being the only one uninjured made his escape to Lonoke where he reported the facts to Sheriff McClintock, who immediately summoned a posse and proceeded to the bloody scene. Gray being unacquainted with the woods they did not reach the spot until 11 o'clock, Thursday night. The posse was halted near the place and the sheriff with Hon. James P. Eagle and Mr. Parrish, went forward to the house where they found the three dead bodies. Robert J. Eagle was shot in the right eye and in the stomach, the gun being so close that his body was badly powder-burnt. Dock Eagle was shot above the left breast and under the right arm. Billy Eagle had twenty nine bullet holes in his body. The bodies had been robbed of their watches, jewelry, guns, horses and equipments. There was nobody at the house when the sheriff arrived but soon after breaking open the door the report of a gun was heard about half a mile distant, thought to be in the direction of Squire Harrington's residence.

The sheriff had the dead bodies removed on horseback a distance of three miles where they were placed in a hack and taken to Lonoke where an inquest was held yesterday by Coroner John A. Woollen. Last evening Coroner Kirby with the posse who went down with him Thursday night arrived in the city. One of his posse named Conner was riding Billy Eagle's horse, which was recognized by Hon. James P. Eagle and turned over to him by Sheriff Oliver. Hon. Eagle was not certain but thought he recognized in the hands of the coroner or one of his posse the Henry rifle of his uncle, Dock Eagle. The coroner was questioned by a Gazette representative but seemed to know little about the matter. When he got there the bodies had been removed and he came back to the city. Conner stated he got Billy Eagle's horse down there. How he did not say. Hon. James P. Eagle is of the opinion that both his uncle's horse and horse of Dock Gray were with the coroner's posse.

Yesterday morning Sheriff Oliver sent D. C. Adams, W. F. Groves and Henry Powers to the scene of the troubles with instructions to arrest all of the parties. Nothing had been heard from them last night, when another posse of almost ten men was sent down to assist them. Sheriff McClintock of Lonoke deputized Sheriff Oliver to make arrests in his county and vice versa. The greatest excitement prevailed throughout the city yesterday and night. Sheriff McClintock leaves for

home this morning and will do all in his power to effect the arrest of the guilty parties. With both sheriffs acting together their arrest ought to be certain.

We were told by a gentleman from Ashley Township last night that he saw and conversed with one of the negroes who claimed to have been on of the party who did the shooting, and that he boasted of having killed two of the Eagles. That being true we do not see that it will be any great difficulty to ferret out the perpetrators of the murders. The whole facts were laid before Gov. Baxter by Hon. James P. Eagle and Sheriff McClintock. He promised to render all assistance in his power to bring the guilty parties to justice.

Further particulars on the deliberate murder of a Constable's posse.

The Hon. James P. Eagle, representative from Lonoke County, Sheriff McClintock, Mr. A. Martin, and several other parties from Lonoke, Arkansas, arrived in the city last evening on a hand-car from Lonoke. Sullivan and Billy Eagle then advanced on them when the negroes jumped from their horses and took to the brush. They then took charge of the horses and hogs and carried them to the house of Squire Sullivan, a few miles distant. On examination the hogs proved to be in Squire Sullivan's mark. The Squire issued writs for the arrest of the two negroes and there being no constable in the township gave them to Robert J. Eagle to serve on Thursday morning. The latter deputized the party who had been hunting together, Dock Eagle, Dock Gray, James Sullivan and Billy Eagle to assist him in serving the writs. They went to the Forbes place, and arriving there found a company of negroes fully armed. On telling the negroes what they came for, they answered they could not be arrested with five hundred men.

Robert J. Eagle, the acting constable, and who had the writs ordered his posse to dismount. As they did so they were fired upon by a lot of negroes concealed in the crib killing instantly Dock Eagle, his son Billy Eagle and Robert J. Eagle his nephew and severely wounding Sullivan. Dock Gray being the only one uninjured made his escape to Lonoke where he reported the facts to Sheriff McClintock, who immediately summoned a posse and proceeded to the bloody scene. Gray being unacquainted with the woods they did not reach the spot until 11 o'clock, Thursday night. The posse was halted near the place and the sheriff with Hon. James P. Eagle and Mr. Parrish, went forward to the house where they found the three dead bodies. Robert J. Eagle was shot in the right eye and in the stomach, the gun being so close that his body was badly powder-burnt. Dock Eagle was shot above the left breast and under the right arm. Billy Eagle had twenty nine bullet holes in his body. The bodies had been robbed of their watches, jewelry, guns, horses and equipments. There was nobody at the house when the sheriff arrived but soon after breaking open the door the report of a gun was heard about half a mile distant, thought to be in the direction of Squire Harrington's residence.

The sheriff had the dead bodies removed on horseback a distance of three miles where they were placed in a hack and taken to Lonoke where an inquest was held yesterday by Coroner John A. Woollen. Last evening Coroner Kirby with the posse who went down with him Thursday night arrived in the city. One of his posse named Conner was riding Billy Eagle's horse, which was recognized by Hon. James P. Eagle and turned over to him by Sheriff Oliver. Hon. Eagle was not certain but thought he recognized in the hands of the coroner or one of his posse the Henry rifle of his uncle, Dock Eagle. The coroner was questioned by a Gazette representative but seemed to know little about the matter. When he got there the bodies had been removed and he came back to the city. Conner stated he got Billy Eagle's horse down there. How he did not say. Hon. James P. Eagle is of the opinion that both his uncle's horse and horse of Dock Gray were with the coroner's posse.

Yesterday morning Sheriff Oliver sent D. C. Adams, W. F. Groves and Henry Powers to the scene of the troubles with instructions to arrest all of the parties. Nothing had been heard from them last night, when another posse of almost ten men was sent down to assist them. Sheriff McClintock of Lonoke deputized Sheriff Oliver to make arrests in his county and vice versa. The greatest excitement prevailed throughout the city yesterday and night. Sheriff McClintock leaves for home this morning and will do all in his power to effect the arrest of the guilty parties. With both sheriffs acting together their arrest ought to be certain.

We were told by a gentleman from Ashley Township last night that he saw and conversed with one of the negroes who claimed to have been on of the party who did the shooting, and that he boasted of having killed two of the Eagles. That being true we do not see that it will be any great difficulty to ferret out the perpetrators of the murders. The whole facts were laid before Gov. Baxter by Hon. James P. Eagle and Sheriff McClintock. He promised to render all assistance in his power to bring the guilty parties to justice.

Governor James P. Eagle was but two when his parents moved to Arkansas. He was reared on a farm, and had his full share of the hard work that usually falls to the lot of a farmer's son, such as splitting rails, log rolling, building fences, plowing, et., and remained with his father pursuing the duties of farm life until the outbreak of the rebellion. He then enlisted in the Confederate army, becoming a member of the Fifth Arkansas State Troops, though shortly afterward he was transferred to the Second Arkansas Mounted Riflemen, commanded by Col. James McIntosh. He entered the ranks as a private soldier, but when a vacancy occurred, in the fall of 1861, he was elected by the members of his company to fill the position of second lieutenant, and in the spring of 1862 was promoted to the captaincy. He subsequently obtained the rank of major in recognition of his gallant services, and

remained in that position until the Confederate Congress passed a law consolidating the Confederate forces, on account of the ranks being thinned; when Gen. D. H. Reynolds' brigade was consolidated into one regiment, known as the First Arkansas Mounted Regiment, dismounted, of which H. C. Bunn was appointed colonel and James P. Eagle lieutenant-colonel. In this position Col. Eagle surrendered with his regiment at Greensboro, North Carolina. During his service he was wounded at Peach Tree Creek, near Atlanta, and laid up for over two months by the wound.

Previous to this, on December 31, 1862, he was captured at the battle of Murfreesboro, Tennessee, and sent to Camp, Ohio, and subsequently to Fort Delaware, where he was exchanged. His actual service covered the period from the battle with Apotholahola in the Indian Territory, until the surrender, taking part in the battles at Pea Ridge, Richmond, Murfreesboro, Chickamauga (under Gen. Joe Johnston from Dalton to Atlanta), and (after recovering from his wound), at Franklin, Nashville and Bentonville, N.C., besides a number of others of lesser note.

After the war he returned to find that his father had died, that the remainder of the family had gone to Texas, and that his home was broken up. He went to work, however, to put his former home in some recognizable shape, and built himself a cabin in which to live. He cultivated the land, and fortune seemed to so smile upon him that he was soon enabled to purchase more land. As the years went by, his success increased, and he added to his lands until now he owned several thousand acres. Seeing the necessity of a more thorough education, he attended school for one year and a half after the war, part of this time being spent at the Mississippi College (Baptist denomination), at Clinton, Mississippi, he being thirty-five years of age at that time. In 1867 he united with the Baptist Church, and in 1870 was ordained to preach. Since then his labors were given to districts where the denomination was not able to pay a minister, and where the Gospel was needed, never asking and never receiving a cent for his ministerial work. He presided over the Arkansas Baptist State Convention for ten successive years. During his absence in Kentucky, in 1872, he received an unsolicited and unexpected nomination from the Democratic party for the State Legislature, and after making a canvass of the district was elected by that body. He served his term, and also a term in the called legislature of 1874, being appointed, with two others, by that body to represent the State and adjust claims arising out of the Brooks Baxter War. In 1877 Col. Eagle was again a member of the State Legislature, and in 1885 was once more elected to the same position, the last time being elected speaker. In 1888 he received the nomination of his party for the Governorship of Arkansas, after a five days' session of the convention, and on the 137th ballot. He was elected by a good majority.

He was blessed with seven grandchildren, Nathan Eagle, Lauren Eagle Walker, Qwenton Oviatt, Clare Eagle, John Eagle, Hollyen Oviatt and Ben Oviatt. He is survived by a sister-in-law and brother-in-law, Patsy and Gip Robetson of North Little Rock, Ark.

Mr. Eagle graduated from Lonoke High School with the class of 1941 and was a graduate from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1946. While a midshipman, he saw naval action in WWII. After graduation he chose to serve his country with a distinguished 20-year career in the U.S. Marine Corps. As a Marine officer he led U.S. armed forces in the Korean War and was on the front line of defence serving his country at the Bay of Pigs, the Cuban Missile Crisis and the War in Vietnam. Mr. Eagle retired from the Marines at the rank of Major in 1966.

His military career took him around the world and he willingly relocated his family from state to state to the new stations that were assigned. He and his wife, Janet, maintained friendships with people around the globe whom they had met through their work and travel. Mr. Eagle believed in the value of education. He worked his whole life so that his children and grandchildren would have the opportunity to advance and achieve to the maximum of their potential through education. Even when his health was failing, he made the effort to attend the graduations of his grandchildren from college and post-graduate institutions across America. On June 4, 2006, Bo was able to attend his 60th college reunion at the Naval Academy in Annapolis, Md.

After retiring from the military, he came home to Lonoke to raise his family and to build and grow a family business in agriculture. He excelled at this through partnering, collaboration and reinvestment in the land. He was a knowledgeable and shrewd investor in real estate and in the financial markets.

Mr. Eagle loved Lonoke and Arkansas. He was a scholar of our history and relished in telling stories of family, of business and of political events that had happened during his life.
