Elijah Brazier, (very speculative: b. 20 Apr 1726). The records just about make it necessary that we posit a brother, Elijah, for James Brazier of Cumberland Co, NC. This is a separate Elijah from the Elijah who was son of James Brazier of Cumberland Co. 1790 Head of Household, Cumberland Co, NC: Elijah Braser, 2 m. 16+, 1 m. 0-16, 5 fem. If one of the males over 16 is a son, he's b. bef. 1774. We have a stray Elijah, b. 1773. There is, also, a report (undocumented and unsubstantiated) that Jane Brasher Armstrong was a daughter of Thomas Brasher, b. 12 Apr 1750, and his wife, Sarah Jane Colby. This Thomas was a son of Elijah Brasher, b. 20 Apr 1726, who married Sarah Thomas. Further, this Elijah may have been a son of Samuel. (Are we talking about South Carolina families???)

Mid 1700's: we are talking almost a century before the Greenville Colony flourished. Elijah Brasher, b. 1726, would be just the right age to be a brother of James Brazier who d. Cumberland Co, NC, 1789. I've always thought

that James had to have a brother named Elijah. Will of Elijah Brazier, dated 1790, Cumberland Co, NC, names children Elijah Jr and Laban; grandchildren James and Leah Brazier. (ref: Old N.C. Wills, 1760-1800, research reported by Lois Breshears Cooper, of Hobbs, NM.) Note that William Brazier, s/o James Brazier, also named a

son Laban in his will dated 20 Sep 1813, in Surry Co, NC. And both this Elijah and James of Cumberland had granddaughters named Leah in their Wills.

Notes for Harris Brazier:

Iredell Co., North Carolina would have been Rowan Co., North Carolina as it was formed out of it in 1788. Harris and William are candidates to be brothers of James Brazier of Cumberland County, North Carolina. Iredell County, North Carolina is on the upper waters of the Catawba River, some 50 miles almost directly north of present day Charlotte. It was formed in 1788 from the western part of Rowan County. The old Indian trading path from Asheboro to Winston-Salem ran through it, as does the

modern Interstate 40.

Harris Brazier and William Brazier and their descendants, also, favored some of the standard Brazier names: William, James, Elijah, Thomas, Henry. [Charles Brashear writes] But I still have no idea of how, or if, they are related to the Braziers of Cumberland County, or Orange/Chatham/Greenville.

Will of Harris Brazier of Rocky Creek, Iredell Co., North Carolina, August 9, 1787 (Book 11, page 695); son David to receive certain land; sons James and William to get land, dividing corner. No mention of wife, nor does wife signed anything.

Rowan Co., Deed Book 11, page 695: 9 August 1787, NC State Grant #1508 to Richard Remington, 640 acres. (??

same book and page refs as "Will of Harris Brazier")

Iredell Co., Deed Book B, page 194, 4 August 1794, John Huntsman sold 100 acres to David Brazier.

Iredell Co., Deed Book D., page 463, 5 October 1801, David Brazier and wife, Elizabeth, sold 50 acres to Harris Brazier.

Iredell Co., Deed Book Q, page 174, 21 August 1811, Harris Brazier (no wife mentioned) sold 60 acres to John

McClellan, part of State grant to Richard Remington, who sold to John Huntsman, who sold to David Brazier, who

sold to his son Harris Brazier, except 8 acres on the East side next to John Armstrong is what John Armstrong let

- ii. William Brazier, died Abt. 1795 in Iredell Co., North Carolina.

Notes for William Brazier:
Will of William Brazier, of Elk Shoal Creek, Iredell Co., North Carolina deed 30 May 1795 (Book 14, page 87), names sons Elijah, James, David, Harris. William Brazier had bought 200 acres in Iredell Co. on 3 Jul 1789 (Deed Book 11, page 58). This William is apparently a brother of Harris Brazier.

These men must have known the South Carolina colony. The Pendleton South Carolina Messenger, Issue of 12 July 1826 reported that there were letters in the Pendleton Post Office for Harris Brasher. What is this: Iredell Co., North Carolina Book D, page 581, David Brazier? "The Brazier grave yard is in a clump of trees, off the road, near Yadkin Valley Church, in Davie Co., North Carolina. There may not be stones for Braziers."

No Thomas named in any of the wills, yet the 1800 Census of Iredell lists Thomas Bashier 10012-21001 (two men over 45 -- b. bef. 1755 [grandpa living with a mature son?] -- and one woman over 45, plus some young sprouts). And the 1810 Census of Iredell lists Thomas Brashears 01001-0201 (1 male over 45 b. bef 1756; 1 male 10-16; 2 females 10-16; 1 female 26-45) There was also a Henry Braseur in the 1810 Iredell Census.

- iii. James Brazier², born Abt. 1710 in Cumberland, North Carolina; died 07 Jun 1790 in Cumberland, North Carolina; married Sarah LNU in North Carolina; died Unknown.

Notes for James Brazier:
16 Mar 1754: James Brazier of Granville Co., North Carolina, entered a Granville Land Grant of 329 acres on the South Side of the Tar River Bridge, "near Simes line." The land was later in Bute Co., a county that has been realigned out of existence; the land seems to have been in present day Franklin County, but the records are in present day Warren Co., North Carolina. James Brazier and his wife, Sarah, of Cumberland Co., North Carolina later sold this land.

July 6, 1757: James Brazier witness the will of George Anderson, Granville Co., North Carolina (Grimes, North Carolina Wills, 1690-1760) Charles Brashears feels this is James Brazier; as there is no other in

the county at this time. The relationship between this James Brazier and the James Braezar who witnessed the will of another George Anderson, 1718, Pasquotank Co., North Carolina is unknown; we can speculate that the two records indicate some kind of familial relationship. Half a century later, on February 1, 1779, John Anderson entered 100 acres (Entry #0261) in Cumberland Co., North Carolina between William Anderson, Sr., and surplus land within James Brazier's.

May 22, 1760: James Brazier's Granville Land Grant #21 of 329 acres was surveyed. "Surveyed for James Brazier, 329 acres of land according to the above plan [Proved to Charles Brashear by Wes Taukchiray with a copy of Granville Grants, Reel 6, part 34-A, North Carolina State Archives], lying in Granville County on South side of Tar River, begins at a water oak at the letter "a," runs by Simses line south 20 degrees west, 216 poles to a hickory at "b," then west 164 p. to a hickory at "c," then north 262 poles to a maple at "d," then down the various courses of the creek to the river, then the river to the first station. Sworn Chain carriers: John Burt, John Gun; surveyed by Thomas Person." The grant was made official on the 16th of March 1761. He signed the indenture with his mark, a cursive "J."

1761 Tax List, Granville Co., North Carolina - Taken by John Pope, lists four taxables in James's household:

James Braisher
William Braisher
John Braisher
Indian girl Poll

William and John were named as sons in the will of James Brazier; since they would have to be 21 to be listed as taxable adults, they were both born before 1740, which would set James's birthday back to the 1710/1720 period or before. Who the indian girl was has not been determined. A band of Saponi Indians lived between Kitrell and Henderson in present day Vance County, North Carolina. They numbered 24 to 28 in 1754, half of them men. In 1761, there were 20 men, plus women and children. The "Indian girl Poll" could well have been from this group (Charles Brashear thanks Wes Taukchiray for a copy of the tax list and the information on the Saponi Indians).

October 26, 1762: William and Mary Blake of Johnson Co., North Carolina sold to James Brazier of Granville Co., 460 acres on south side of Tar River on both sides of Mill Creek. Signed: William [X] Blake, Mary N. Blake. Witnessed: John Burt, Thomas Jones, Recorded 1763. For some years, James traded this and another parcel of land (his Granville Grant) back and forth with neighbors.

Bute Co. Deeds Book A, page 206: James Brazier and wife Sarah to John Townsend of Caroline Co., VA, for ___ pounds Virginia money, 789 acres in two tracts, one by patent, 329 acres on south side of Tar river, Bellies Creek, adjoining Sims; 460 acres adjoining first tract. Witnessed: William Brack, James Murry, William Brazar, John Townsend, April 1765, recorded July 1765. [William Brazar is believed to be James's son, who is named in James's will and who moved from the Cumberland/Wake line to Surry Co., NC around 1800.

Bute Co. Deeds Book 1, page 78: John Townsend to James Brazor, carpenter, of Cumberland Co., for 90 pounds Virginia money, 789 acres in Bute Co., on south side of Tar River on Mill Creek where Townsend now lives. He bought 329 acres of this land 20 Feb 1765 from James Brazor, it being a Granville Grant... remaining 460 acres was bought from James Brazor 20 Jul 1765, he having bought it 16 Oct 1762 from William Blake, it being an Earl Granville Grant. Witnessed by: Osborn Jeffries, Simon West, Thomas Smith.

Bute Co. Deeds Book 3, page 120: James Brazier and Sarah, his wife, of Cumberland Co., 17 Aug 1768 to Stephen Lowe of Bute Co., for 80 pounds Virginia money, two tracts, one 329 acres on south side of Tar River, adj. Sims; two, 460 acres above James Murry. Witnessed: Giles Bowers, proved by William Russell, Registered: December 2, 1771.

The Tar river headwaters is present-day Person County near the Virginia line, then runs through Granville, Vance, Franklin (adjoins Warren), Nash, Edgecombe, and Pitt Counties, before emptying into the Pamlico River and Pamlico Sound on the central coast of North Carolina. This is about 90 miles northeast and two major waterways away from where James ended up in Cumberland County, though a major roadway ran from present-day Fayetteville in Cumberland Co., through Raleigh and Bute Co., and into Virginia.

When James and Sarah Brazier moved to Cumberland County, William Brazier/Brasser apparently went with them. He bought there in 1769 and sold it in 1774. Then he returned to Wake County. North Carolina entry permit #136 was issued 4 March 1776 to William Brazier, to enter 100 acres of "vacant land in Wake County, lying on both sides of Reedy Creek, on the upper side of his plantation, joining his own line."

North Carolina entry permit #362, 3 June 1778, to Joseph Blake, allows him to enter 550 acres of "vacant land in Wake County, lying on both sides of Reedy Creek, joining Robertson Hendon's line, and the lines of William Morgan and William Brasser, including his mill and improvements."

Cumberland County, North Carolina, is directly downstream from Orange/Chatham. The Haw river is joined by the Deep river in the vicinity of the old Chatham/Cumberland county line (now in Lee Co.), becomes the Cape Fear river, then flows on southeast-ward toward the south coast of North Carolina. James Brazier's land in Cumberland County was on Parker Creek and very near the present-day boundary of Wake and Harnett Counties. About a century later, in 1845, C.M. Brazier [?who] sold 40 acres on Long Creek, apparently a branch of Parker Creek, to Joseph Johnson. (Cumberland Co., Deeds, Book 46, page 269). What could be the relationship with the James Brazier who was on the Orange Co., Tax List in 1779? Contact would have been simple by boat.

James Brazier and his descendants favored a number of standard Brazier names: James, John, William, Elijah, Laban, Leah.

WILL OF JAMES BRAZIER

In The name of God amen, I JAMES BRAZIER of the county of Cumberland and state of North Carolina being in a low state of health of body but being in perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for it and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say, principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the hand of almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the direction of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty powers of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased almighty God to bless me in this life. I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form first I give and bequeath to my grandson JAMES BRAZIER, son of ELIJAH BRAZIER two hundred and fifty acres of land where on my mill stands and likewise the mill with it. I give and bequeath to LABON BRAZIER one Negro woman named Trener(?). I likewise give and bequeath my riding horse bridle and saddle to JAMES BRAZIER son of WILLIAM BRAZIER. I give and bequeath to WILLIAM BRAZIER son of WILLIAM BRAZIER one feather bed and furniture. I likewise give and bequeath one feather bed to LEAH BRAZIER daughter of JOHN BRAZIER ___ and the remaining part of my household furniture with all my stock I give and bequeath to my two sons WILLIAM BRAZIER and ELIJAH BRAZIER to be equally divided between them ---- I likewise constitute my son ELIJAH BRAZIER to sole executor of this my last will and testament all and singular my land negroes and tenements by them freely to be possessed and enjoyed and I hereby utterly disclose revoke and annul all and every other former testament will legacies bequeaths and Executors by me in anywise before named wills bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament. In writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 7th day of June one thousand seven hundred eighty nine.
